

An extensive range of activities have been lined up for Newark and Sherwood District Council's latest 'Day of Action'





Awards at Goose Fair dinner honour the best of Nottingham

parents and children in disadvantaged communities, disaffected young people and children with disabilities have been honoured in the Nottingham Awards 2019.

The awards, now in their eighth year, were held at the Council House recently following the historic 725th Goose Fair opening and dinner.

They celebrate those who have helped to make Nottingham the great city that it is, and each winner has made a lasting contribution. The categories and winners for 2019 are:

Private Sector - George Akins

George has turned his live music business DHP Family into a major brand, with local venues such as Rock City, the Rescue Rooms and the Bodega now nationally and internationally known names, along with iconic venues in London and Bristol. DHP Family has won the national promoter of the year award on a number of occasions, and undertook the world's biggest ever tour with Ed

The award is in recognition of George organising the Beat the Streets festival to raise money for homeless people, which has raised almost £200,000 for Framework over the past two years

Voluntary Sector - Dalton Stephens

Dalton Stephens is well known in St Ann's where he has lived since being young, when he made some poor choices, and is now known for turning his life around dramatically over the last five years. He has gone on to help young people in the city to widen their horizons by sharing his negative experiences and consequences of his past, helping them avoid going to prison.

As a volunteer he has established and developed a successful all-year-round weekly sport session in a local park, helped to develop relationships between the community and local police and engaged young people through a community recording studio.

Special Awards - David Stewart

David Stewart has benefited many Nottingham children and families, some of whom have very complex needs. He has been described as a great role model of kindness, passion, determination, and effective teaching. He retired as Head of the Oak Field School this summer, having previously been Head at Nottingham Shepherd School.

For nearly 30 years he directed the College St Inclusive Theatre Company, which won an Edinburgh Festival Fringe First. He oversees several arts clubs for adults with learning disabilities in the city. David is internationally recognised for his work and is an honorary doctor of the University of Nottingham.

Public Sector - Phyllis Brackenbury

It is 40 years since Phyllis Brackenbury became a midwife at Nottingham City Hospital. Since then she has worked with children and families as a midwife, or in leadership roles within the NHS, Nottingham CityCare and Nottingham City Council. She became a parental participation manager in 'Sure-Start' in St Ann's and developed centres in Radford and Hyson Green. She then oversaw extending the provision of eight Sure Start Centres to 18 Children's Centres.

In 2014 she led a successful bid which brought the £45 million 'Small Steps, Big Changes' (SSBC) to Nottingham, which has so far improved the life chances for 3,500 0-3 year olds in Aspley, Bulwell, Hyson Green, Arboretum and St Ann's. Phyllis also played a leading role in Nottingham becoming the UK's largest Imagination Library to encourage

Councillor Rebecca Langton, Portfolio Holder for One Nottingham, said: "The people who have received a Nottingham Award this year are very worthy winners who have made a real and lasting difference to the lives of vulnerable local people.

"It's right that we recognise their contribution to the life of the city and thank them on behalf of the many people who have benefited from this. People like these make Nottingham what it is - a warm, welcoming and inclusive city where people look after each other.'

Motorists encouraged to switch off engines for cleaner air

Nottingham City Council will begin taking action against idling – drivers who leave their engines running while waiting, particularly outside schools, at taxi ranks and at level crossings.

In a survey last year, 82 per cent of respondents supported taking action against engine idling, and the council will now be able to issue drivers leaving their engines running with a £20 fine.

Councillor Sally Longford, deputy leader of Nottingham City Council and portfolio holder for Energy and Environment said: "Clean air is important for us all to lead healthy lives and this is even more significant in children whose lungs are still developing. Switching your engine off while waiting is such a simple change but can have huge benefits for air quality and public health.

"City wide we've taking bold steps to ensure that we have cleaner air. Transport emissions are one of the largest contributors to poor air quality, so many of our efforts have focused on this area – we've cleaned up older diesel buses, invested in biogas and electric buses, installed 300 charge points for electric vehicles, improved cycling facilities and of course the electric tram.

"This newest measure is to promote cleaner air on a local level; signs will be going up to promote the anti-idling message. The purpose of this is not to fine drivers but to educate them. Our Community Protection Officers will be outside schools talking to drivers waiting with engines running about the health implications of idling, asking them to switch off their engines. Only those who refuse to switch off when asked will be issued with a fine."

Obesity among reception-aged schoolchildren in England increased between 2017-18 and 2018-19, new statistics from NHS Digital show.

The National Child Measurement Programme, England – 2018-19 report, published recently shows that the prevalence of obesity in four and five-year-olds rose from 9.5% in 2017-18 to 9.7% in 2018-19. This equates to 58,000 children.

This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the earliest comparable year in 2006-07 when obesity prevalence in reception-aged children stood at 9.9 per cent. Among year 6 pupils, who are aged 10 and 11, obesity prevalence was 20.2% in 2018-19 (121,000 children). This is similar to the level in 2017-18 when it was 20.1%.

The earliest comparable figures for year 6 pupils date back to 2009-10 when obesity prevalence was 18.7%. This is an increase of 1.5 percentage points over nine years.

The National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) – overseen by Public Health England and analysed and reported by NHS Digital – measures the height and weight of over one million children in England annually and provides robust data on the number of children in reception and year 6 who are underweight, healthy weight, overweight, obese or severely obese.

In 2018-19, 22.6% of reception children and 34.3% of year 6 children were either overweight or obese. The report also shows:

- Around three quarters of reception children were a healthy weight (76.5%). In year 6 it was around two thirds (64.3%).
- Severe obesity prevalence was higher in year 6 (4.4%) compared to reception (2.4%).
- The proportion of underweight children was higher in year 6 (1.4%) than in reception (1.0%).
