

Local Drivers Urged Co Be 'Bike Smart

Analysis by Brake, the road safety charity, has found that more than a third of all deaths and serious injuries on East Midlands' roads was a bike rider. Bike riders' safety is being highlighted as part of national Road Safety Week this week, 19-25 November, coordinated annually by Brake with the 2018 theme 'Bike Smart'.

Brake's analysis has highlighted the vulnerability of those on two wheels, who, in comparison with car drivers, are on average 34 times more likely to be killed and 63 times more likely to be killed or seriously injured, per mile travelled, on British roads.

Cyclists and motorcyclists account for nearly 4 in 10 of all deaths and serious injuries on British roads, a total of 9,740 in 2017, or an average of one bike death or serious injury every hour. Bike



deaths also make up more than a quarter of all British road deaths, with a total of 101 cyclist deaths and 349 motorcyclist deaths in

A survey of more than 1,000 drivers, commissioned by Brake for Road Safety Week, found that the majority of drivers (52%) feel that bike riders are most vulnerable on urban roads. Department for

however, show that rural roads pose three times the risk of a fatal crash for both cyclists and motorcyclists, compared with urban roads

This year, thousands of organisations, schools and community groups are backing the 'Bike Smart' campaign, helping to raise awareness about the safety of those on two

Road Safety Week is calling for drivers to be 'Bike Smart' and be more aware of bikes by: slowing down, giving more time to spot danger and react; looking properly for bikes before pulling out at junctions; leaving at least 150cm between cars and a bike when overtaking; and by doing the 'Dutch reach'. using the opposite hand to open a car door to help avoid 'car dooring' incidents.

Joshua Harris, director of campaigns at Brake, said: "Road Safety Week is a vital loudspeaker for individuals, communities and organisations to shout about road safety and raise awareness of the risks on our roads. With one bike rider being killed or seriously injured every hour in Britain, there is no better time for us all to be more 'Bike Smart'

Due to popular demand, Gedling Borough Council has extended its annual free bulky waste collection which began last week instead of in January.

Gedling Borough Council is offering a free collection of large household items to all residents. The first collections will initially be collected on Saturdays only, until January when residents can choose weekday collections up until the scheme ends in February.

New Visiting Times for Nottingham Hospitals

New, extended and more flexible visiting times will be introduced at Queen's Medical Centre (QMC) and Nottingham City Hospital from Monday 19 November, in direct response to patient, visitor and carer feedback. The new visiting times on adult wards will be 11am-8.30pm

Helena Durham, patient representative and a member of the Patient Partnership Group at Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust (NUH), said: "Extended visiting times is a really positive step forward. We all know how important the presence of carers, relatives and friends is to patients' recovery and overall experience in hospital. The Trust is committed to person-centred visiting to ensure patients feel supported and their loved ones included as fully as possible in their care and treatment."

There are some exceptions to these visiting arrangements, including on Maternity and Neonatal Units and Children's Wards, as follows:

- Maternity Units: open to partners all day (others 11am- 8.30pm)
- Neonatal Units: open to parents all day (2-4pm and 6-9pm for other family members)
- Children's Wards: open to parents all day (others 8am-8pm)

Going the Extra Mile

A doctor who always goes the extra mile has picked up an award at Sherwood Forest Hospitals' annual Staff Excellence Awards after he was nominated by a patient.

Dr Steve Jones, a haematology consultant at King's Mill Hospital, was awarded The People's Award, which was nominated for by members of the public and patients. It was one of 18 awards that were given out to staff who work at King's Mill Hospital, Mansfield Community Hospital and Newark Hospital to celebrate

their achievements and dedication to delivering outstanding care and service to patients.

Dr Steve Jones said: "It was a humbling experience to receive the award and hear such positive feedback. As a team, we're all about treating patients and putting them first so to be nominated by a patient is the highest form of praise and reinforces what we do and why we do it."

The Chair of the Trust also presented a special award to an overall winner and this went to the Learning Disabilities team at the Trust for



their hard work with partner organisations to identify vulnerable patients before they

come into hospital.

Bingham Pays Homage with Touching Dedication

Leading developers Barratt Homes North Midlands and David Wilson Homes East Midlands are paying homage to the fallen of Bingham in a ceremony that honoured the recent World War One

They joined forces with the Royal British Legion, Bingham Heritage Trails Association, Rushcliffe Borough Council, Bingham Town Council and the Mercian Regiment of the British Army for the remembrance event at their new development in the market town.

Each of the new street names at the site have been named after heroes fallen in World War One and the first was unveiled at the event by Commander Judith Swann, Deputy Lieutenant of Nottinghamshire.

She said: "It is important that we continue to remember those who served in WW1 and this is an excellent way to permanently acknowledge those individuals from Bingham who lost their lives. I was very proud to unveil the first street name, Dunsmore Avenue, dedicated to Private Joseph Dunsmore who died on 21st March 1918."

More than 900 pupils across three schools painted poppies onto house bricks which have been used to form two giant wreath installations at the new entrance to the development.



GROUND-BREAKING MEMORIAL PLANS COME TO LIFE

Councillor Dave Trimble, Portfolio Holder for Leisure and Localities at Nottingham City Council and Councillor Susan Saddington, Chairman of Nottinghamshire County Council, met on 14 November to break ground at Victoria Embankment, where a new War Memorial will display the names of the 14,000 fallen soldiers, sailors, airmen and civilians from across the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire area during World War I.

Work will continue over winter and spring, with the memorial likely to be revealed and open to the public in summer 2019, in time for Armed Forces Day.

The new memorial will be an elevated, circular design allowing a protected space for reflection. An inscribed monument will feature in the middle of the memorial, explaining the purpose of the

memorial and with space lower down for poppies to be placed in the lead up to future Remembrance Days and other events. Lighting underneath these holes will create a stunning effect at night for visitors.

Currently, there are hundreds of individual memorials to Nottingham and Nottinghamshire's Great War fallen, scattered across the county but nowhere that

brings together all of their names in one place.

Names of the fallen will be etched into the circular stone surrounding the monument, with lighting atop the ring to illuminate the surface and the names.

£80,000 is being raised for the project through fundraising to support the commission of the memorial. Local businesses and residents from across Nottinghamshire are being encouraged to contribute, which can be done online at nosf.org.uk/roll-of-honour.html.



Gold Award for Sustainable Homes



The accreditation body SHIFT (Sustainable Homes Index for Tomorrow) is run by Sustainable Homes and is the sustainability standard for the housing sector.

Sir Paul Smith visited the University of Nottingham on Monday 12 November to deliver the first in a new series of Vice-Chancellor's public lectures to over 250 students, staff and members of the public and business community.

The day was closed by a visit from a parent who brought along some WWI artefacts including medic packs and genuine uniforms for children to look at.



quarters of Nottingham residents still don't know how they plan on spending the day, as a new survey reveals that over a third of us worry about making festive plans.

Contact the Elderly, the only national charity to tackle isolation through face to face contact, commissioned the research to highlight the impact of societal pressures on families over Christmas and the impact it can have on older people left to spend Christmas alone.

The research found that only 25% of people in Nottingham have totally confirmed their Christmas plans for this year's festivities. For 56% of Nottingham residents, those plans normally involve staying at home and a third of all respondents say that Christmas regularly involves visiting older relatives.

The charity released the festive research to coincide with the news that they've joined forces with Community Christmas, an organisation which aims to

The Community Christmas website lists events taking place across Nottingham that are open to older people in the community who would otherwise be spending Christmas alone, varying from community Christmas lunches and sit-down dinners to tea and cake or carol

Meryl Davies, Chief Executive of Contact the Elderly, said: "Everyone recognises that Christmas can be a difficult time of year, particularly for people who are isolated or vulnerable.

"We want to ensure Community Christmas continues to grow and to encourage people across the UK to think about any older people in their local communities who might not have plans for Christmas Day.'

prickly neighbours with five tips on making gardens into a haven for

hedgehogs in Nottinghamshire.

The developers, which have joined forces with the RSPB to set a new benchmark in wildlife friendly developments, are encouraging households to watch out for hedgehogs and other small animals.

Homeowners are encouraged by wildlife experts to open up their own 'hedgehog highways' between their gardens, as thriving hedgehog populations need access to numerous gardens. This can be as simple as a CD-sized hole in the bottom of the fence. A 'hedgehog highway' is created by linking up multiple gardens and allowing safe passage for the creatures to come and go.

Help hedgehogs in your garden:

- Create a haven for your garden hedgehog. A hedgehog habitat provides a dry, safe home but even a board against a fence will be a welcome retreat for your night time visitor.
- 2 Cover drains and holes as a hedgehog may fall in, and ensure there is an escape route in ponds. Always check for hedgehogs before using strimmers or mowers, particularly under hedges where animals may rest.
- 3 Don't touch a hedgehog unless you think it is injured. If you do have to pick up a hedgehog, make sure you wear suitable gardening gloves or use a folded towel.
- Put out fresh water for hedgehogs in the garden but don't feed them milk as they are lactose intolerant. Tinned meaty cat or dog food and even dry cat or dog food is a useful addition to a hedgehog's diet.
- Speak to your neighbours about hedgehogs and their plight, to encourage them to make a hole in their fence too.


