

## Be a Nottingham

A local charity is calling on the people of Nottinghamshire to help break a Nottingham-themed World Record in aid of Nottingham Children's Hospital this spring.

Nottingham Hospitals Charity is holding Robin's Big World Record at Wollaton Park on bank holiday Monday 7 May 2018. The Charity hopes to break the Guinness World Record for the largest gathering of people dressed as Robin Hood.

The Nottingham legend is also the mascot for Nottingham Children's Hospital and the Big Appeal, which aims to raise £4 million young patients and their families at the Children's Hospital, which is based at the Queen's Medical Centre.

The Charity is asking people of all ages to get involved by signing up to the event and coming along on the day wearing a Robin

As well as the official World Record attempt, the event will include market stalls, games and family fun, with all proceeds going to the Big Appeal.
Stephanie Smith, Clinical Director at Not-

tingham Children's Hospital, said: "We're delighted to be part of this unique event and hope the people of Nottingham and Nottinghamshire will all rally together to have fun, support a great cause and hopefully break a World Record at the same time. The money raised will make a real difference to patients and families here at Nottingham Children's

Hospital, many of whom spend weeks or even months at a time in our care. We want sick children and their families to have the best possible experience during what can be an extremely difficult time. Sophie Bramwell's nephew Max has been cared for at the Neonatal Unit since his birth last November and his family is supporting the Big Appeal.

Sophie said: "As a family we have been overwhelmed by the care and support Max has received and felt that we just wanted to give something back. We discussed a number of different events that we'd like to take part in such as runs and bake sales but thought Robin's Big World Record would be a great chance for us to do something to include the whole family, including little Max and his cousins. We can't wait to get everyone dressed up!"

Nigel Gregory, Director of Development at Nottingham Hospitals Charity, came up with the idea of a Robin Hood themed World Record attempt. He said: "We wanted to do something that everyone in Nottingham can get involved in – young and old alike. Robin Hood is not only our Children's Hospital mascot but a true Nottingham legend, and we're excited to see hundreds of Robins all in one place."

Bus drivers and colleagues from trentbarton have raised almost £25,000 for the children's charity When You Wish Upon a Star, which makes dreams come true for children living with a lifethreatening illness.

The Nottingham based charity was cho-

Thanks to the fast actions of a friend and the collaborative approach from two hospital Trusts, Nottinghamshire patient, Julie Bacon, is on the road to making a full recovery after having a severe stroke in late December.

On 21 December Julie, 58, from Sutton in Ashfield, was out having a meal with her friend, Beverley Stringfellow. She went to use the bathroom and did not come back for some time, so Beverley went to look for her. She found Julie slumped in the toilet and quickly phoned for an ambulance.

Julie was then taken to King's Mill Hospital, where she was quickly assessed by the stroke team, who found that Julie had totally lost her speech, could not see out of her left eye and had lost all movement in her right arm and leg.

The team knew they needed to act fast and managed to administer the clot-busting drug (a procedure known as thrombolysis) within 29 minutes of Julie's arrival to A&E.

Sherwood Forest Hospitals Specialist Stroke Nurse, Emma Gillies explains the importance of this: "It is really important to administer the clot-busting drug within four and a half hours of stroke symptoms starting to try and disperse the clot and return the blood supply to the brain. This is why it is crucial to get suspected stroke patients to A&E and seen by the stroke specialist team as soon as possible. Our Stroke Unit has a dedicated phone line that A&E use to contact us, so we can act as quickly as possible, so this really did help in Julie's case."

As soon as Julie had received the clot-busting treatment and a CT angiogram, which confirmed she had a clot blocking the circulation to the left side of the brain from the carotid in the neck upwards, a decision was made to transfer her to Nottingham's Queens Medical Centre to have a pioneering procedure known as a mechanical thrombectomy – a specialist procedure (only performed at neuroscience centres in the UK) where a Consultant Interventional Neuroradiologist uses catheters and stent-like devices to remove the clot blocking the brain blood vessel.

By 6:20pm on the same day, Julie had received the treatment that she needed. After an overnight admission to QMC under the care of the neurology team, she was transferred back to King's Mill Hospital the following day, which is closer to her home and family. One day later she was able to speak, see better from her right side and could walk with supervision. Julie's Husband, Gary Bacon said: "We can't thank both hospitals enough. Julie is making a fantastic re-



covery thanks to the treatment that she received from the Queens Medical Centre and thanks to the fast actions and care from King's Mill Hospital.

'To say that she had a stroke on the 22nd and was home by 28th December is pretty amazing, we are quite surprised by the improvements she has made so quickly. I didn't realise at the time quite how pioneering the treatment at QMC is, but I'm so pleased Julie was able to have it and is making such great progress. To look at her you wouldn't even know that she has had a stroke." Julie is now having therapy with Sherwood Forest Hospital's Early Supported Discharge team who will deliver stroke therapy every day for the next four weeks in her own home. Garv added The therapy team have been great and the sessions are going really well. It's great to have this kind of support at home, so that Julie can gain confidence again in her own surroundings.

Stroke Consultant Dr Anoja Rajapakse, who treated Julie when she was first admitted, added: "It is fantastic that Julie has made such an amazing recovery since her stroke. When she came in she was scoring really high on the National Institutes of Health Stroke Scale (NIHSS), indicating that she had had a severe stroke. To see Julie making such progress in such a short space of time really is fantastic.

"I'd also like to thank colleagues at Nottingham University Hospitals (NUH) for their great team work and Sherwood Forest Hospitals Consultant Radiologist, Dr Jayant Vanjari, who also provided excellent support. I'm really proud that we are able to offer such a high level of care to our patients whilst working in collaboration with our partners at NUH."

Sherwood Forest Hospitals is one of the best in the country and top in the East Midlands for recognising and treating patients who have had a stroke. The Trust has the second highest score in the country out of 140 Trusts, after being given an A rating by the Sentinel Stroke National Audit Programme (SSNAP).

#### Local champion and Bilsthorpe Flying High Academy unite

Bilsthorpe Flying High Academy has taken receipt of a defibrillator thanks to the efforts of some school fundraising, local residents and businesses, all galvanised by a local champion, Keeley Ward.

Keeley Ward is an unusually busy person. A resident of Bilsthorpe and mum of an energetic 2-year-old, she works full time, is the Chair of Bilsthorpe's Branch of the Royal British Legion and is the Unit Manager for St John Badger's. In June last year she added to her schedule the wish to raise enough money to buy four defibrillators for the community's use, costing a whopping £8,000. By November Keely had reached her goal thanks to the help of local residents, businesses and grants from charitable and commercial organisations.

Now Bilsthorpe has defibrillators installed at Bilsthorpe Miners Welfare and the Methodist Church, Kirklington Road in the old village, and as of this week, a new unit was delivered to Bilsthorpe Flying High Academy. Keeley said, "Now Bilsthorpe will have four defibrillators, including the one based at the school. Local residents helped to raise the money and the school did their own fundraising to help and also received



some funds from The British Heart Foundation." Contributors to the overall fundraising included The Flying High Trust, Tesco Groundworks/ One Stop, Hucknall Round Table, Oakwood Fuels, British Heart Foundation, Centre Parcs, Strawsons, and Edwinstowe and Dukeries Lions Club.

Keeley says that no training is necessary for the devices as they issue their own instructions, though staff at the school have undergone training as part of their First Aid instruction and training will become available for anyone interested from the community.

"This is such an important advance for the community and as a school we were eager to play a part. #### Forever Stars Chosen By Shoppers as Intu Charity of the Year 2018

A local charity that funds bereavement suites for parents of stillborn babies has been selected as charity of the year 2018 for the two intu centres in Nottingham. Intu made the exciting announcement that Forever Stars has been selected by the public to receive all of the pennywishes donated into the Emett Clock at intu Victoria Centre on 12 January. Intu's general manager for intu Victoria Centre and intu Broadmarsh, Nigel Wheatley, was joined by Forever Stars founders Richard and Michelle Daniels. who were inspired to set up the charity when their daughter Emily was stillborn in 2013.

Beeston-based charity Forever Stars funds support services for those affected by neonatal baby loss. In 2016 it set up the Serenity Suite at the Queen's

Medical Centre in Nottingham and in December 2017, it opened another at the City Hospital. The suites provide a permanent facility to cater for parents whose children are stillborn.

The exciting announcement follows a public vote on intu Victoria Centre's Facebook page. In total, 685 people voted for Forever Stars to become intu's charity of the year 2018.

Over £5,650 has been raised for local adult hospice Treetops in a scheme to collect and recycle old Christmas trees.

Over 400 trees are being collected from across Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire in the Treetops Treecycling scheme. Collections are made in return for a donation towards the hospice which provides nursing care and emotional support for adults and their families.

The scheme is growing in popularity as Mary Rose, senior community and events fundraiser explained:

This is the third year of Treecycling and every year the number of trees collected and the donations we receive - goes up.
"This year we've been able

to expand the postcode areas where we're collecting trees from as we've had amazing support from Ward Recycling.

"We want to say a huge thanks to everyone who's been involved. We're looking forward to building the Treecycling service up to be even bigger and more successful next year!"

### Blue lights behind you?

EMAS is asking motorists to be vigilant in looking out for blue lights after ambulance crews were involved in 90 road traffic collisions in eight months which were not their fault.

Between April and November, 90 non-fault insurnce claims were made by EMAS.

We are now asking drivers to remember to look out for flashing blue lights and listen out for sirens, particularly at junctions, and not to panic when they do see them.

steve Farnsworth, General Manager of Fleet, said: "Our vehicles drive millions of miles each year, much of the time faster than normal, so having some incidents when driving is inevitable.

"However, we are asking motorists sharing the roads with our ambulance crews to be vigilant when checking for flashing blue lights at junctions and in their mirrors

Each time one of our ambulances is damaged or involved in a collision, it cannot be used to respond to patients experiencing an emergency. By double checking for blue lights, you can help to reduce the

#### What to do if you see flashing blue lights coming through:

•Don't brake suddenly, stay calm and give yourself time to plan your next move

•Look for somewhere to pull over and stop if it is

•If there is nowhere to safely pull over continue to travel at normal road speed - the driver of the ambulance will look for a safe place to overtake you.

•Be aware that there may be more than one emergency vehicle coming through so listen out for si-rens and check around you for more blue flashing

•Do not try to out-run the emergency vehicle

### Ray of Hope for People with A

Age-related macular degeneration (AMD) is a painless eye condition that causes you to lose central vision, usually in both eyes. AMD currently affects more than 600,000 people in the UK and is the leading cause of vision loss. By 2020, it's predicted almost 700,000 people will have late-stage AMD in the UK leaving them legally blind.

The condition is most common in people over the age of 50. It's estimated 1 in every 10 people over 65 have some degree of AMD. It is almost an inevitable part of the ageing process.

Central vision is what you see when

you focus straight ahead. In AMD, this vision becomes increasingly blurred, which means: •reading becomes difficult •colours appear less vibrant

•people's faces are difficult to recognise This sight loss usually happens gradually over time, although it can sometimes be rapid.

Sadly there is little that can be done to arrest the progression of the AMD and the vision goes steadily down. There is some evidence that multivitamins can help slow down the rate of visual loss. Eventually some people are left with a scar at the back of the eye which detects no light and therefore the central vision is simply non-existent resulting in a significant reduction in quality of life.

People with AMD often have a co-existent cataract and they often undergo cataract surgery in the hope of improving their vision.


In normal cataract surgery we put a lens (an intraocular lens or IOL) into the eye that is designed to focus light accurately onto the centre of the macula. If this area of retina is already damaged then we are simply focussing all the light energy on an area of retina which will never detect it. Vision is often no better and actually

New developments have given some hope for patients with AMD who are desperate for some restoration of sight. Lenses that act as telescopes and the new EyeMax lenses are available. In patients with AMD the EyeMax lens aims to better the vision of an ordinary monofocal lens but also offer protection against deterioration over the preceding

There are also newly developed lenses which can be implanted even if previous cataract surgery has been undertaken. Some new lenses improve vision by

causing a magnification effect. Rather than focussing the light on the scar at the back of the eye they magnify the image up to bridge over the scar and use areas of retina that still work. The EyeMax uses wavefront technology to spread the incoming image over the whole macula rather than a small portion therefore bridging over areas of affected macula. The latter lens can also future proof vision as if a small portion of the macula worsens the rest can compensate and preserve functional vision. Amar Alwitry





#### Centre announces five more years of osteoarthritis research funding

for Sport, Exercise and Osteoarthritis has been awarded a further £2m from Arthritis Research UK to continue its research into improv-ing the understanding of the effects of sport and exercise on joint

health and osteoarthritis. First established in 2013, the Arthritis Research UK Centre for Sport, Exercise and Osteoarthritis is led by Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust and continues as a consortium of six universities: Nottingham, Oxford, Southampton, Bath, Loughborough and

The Centre consists of an established group of world-leading researchers in sport and exercise tology, skeletal muscle biology, physiotherapy, podiatry, occupa-tional therapy, epidemiology and physiology.

The first five years of Centre funding (2013-17) focused primarily on research with elite sports includ-ing Olympic athletes, professional footballers, cricketers and rugby

players.
The next five years' research (2018-22) will build upon existing research findings to answer the following questions in recreational athletes and exercisers

• Can we identify risk factors and phenotypes ('bodytypes') that predict the onset and progression of symptomatic OA in athletes and exercisers? (Prevent)

• What is the effectiveness of conservative interventions for the prevention and management of OA to enable lifelong physical activity? (Care)

· How can we identify the effects of sport and exercise on the quality of life for those at risk of, or currently living with OA: physi cal, psychological and social wellbeing? (Transform)

The Centre will continue to work with sports representatives, patients, the public and carers, to answer these questions.

Professor Mark Batt, Director of

the Arthritis Research UK Centre, says the new research aims to improve the health and quality of life

of people living with or at risk of developing osteoarthritis: "Hav-ing learned a great deal about the impact of sport, exercise on joint and muscle health by working with athletes over the last five years, this funding will enable us to answer fundamental questions about preventing, treating and transforming the lives of people with osteoarthritis.

"The Centre has established expert teams from a wide range of disciplines who have collaborated nationally and internationally to nprove our understanding of the effects of exercise and injury on musculoskeletal health, including osteoarthritis. Now we will be able to continue to expand our knowl-

edge and develop the next generation of researchers in these fields, working directly with patients, communities and sports people." Osteoarthritis is the most common form of arthritis and is estimated to affect over 8 million people in the UK. It is a long-term condition that can affect any joint but is most frequently seen in the small joints of the hands, the spine, hips and knees. It causes pain, stiffness and swelling in the joints, which can in turn lead to a lack of mobility and the ability to carry out day-to-day activities. Ten per cent of the world's population aged 60 years and older is estimated to have ymptoms of osteoarthritis, but little has been known about the triggers which lead to its development or how it could be prevented.

Natalie Carter, Head of Research

Liaison & Evaluation at Arthritis Research UK, said: "Through working with elite footballers, cricketers and rugby players, the centre has already significantly increased our understanding about the potential long-term impact of sport on the joints.
"Over the next five years, we hope

this research will also help us to pinpoint links and uncover risk factors for osteoarthritis in the wider population, which could in turn lead to innovative ways to treat or prevent the condition, and improve the quality of life for people living with osteoarthritis.



#### £180,000 project to put church at heart of community

St Helen's Church, Trowell, is reopening after a major renovation scheme designed to make it a focal point of the local community.

The improvements have been four years in the planning but were initially driven by a desire to install a modern heating system to keep the church warm in the coldest winter weather.

The scheme grew and the church now also has a newly insulated floor which runs at one level right through to the communion rail, giving full disabled access. Pews have been replaced with chairs, a new glazed oak outer door at the porch has replaced the old iron gate, a new audio/music system has been installed with an induction loop for hearing aid users, and the new video/data projection system is unique in the village for community use.

Phases three and four of the scheme will follow to tackle issues involving power and lighting, the vestry/crèche, some internal stonework, cleaning of the nave walls and the restoration of historical and heritage features

The whole scheme will cost about £180,000, of

which a significant portion is being raised by the congregation through direct giving and fundraising, with the rest coming from grants, particularly from WREN, a not for profit business that awards grants to community, environmental and heritage projects

across the UK.

WREN managing director Peter Cox said: "WREN makes a difference to people's lives by awarding grants to community, environmental and heritage projects. We're delighted to support St Helen's Trowell and their valuable work."

The Rector, the Revd Dr Andy Lord, said: "We are grateful to everyone who has pulled together and given generously to make this happen. Church buildings have never been about serving the past but about ena-bling current communities to come closer together and closer to God. It is Jesus who draws together the

past, present and future in hope and action."
Church treasurer David Wright said: "Whilst remaining primarily as a place of Christian worship, our renewal project seeks to return the use of the church building to the people, much as it would have been prior to Victorian times, but fit for use in present day society".

Events that could now take place in the church, free-ing up space in the church hall, include school activities, midweek meetings, the Village Coffee Pot, charity events, youth and children's work, arts and flowers festivals, music and drama events.

A special service, led by the Bishop of Sherwood, the Rt Revd Tony Porter, will be held on January 14 to celebrate the completion of the project's first two

St Helen's can trace its roots back to the early ninth century when Trowell was a tiny Saxon settlement in the kingdom of Mercia, ruled by King Coenwulf. Permission was given for a church, made from wood and wattle, to be built on the site in AD801 at the request of the people. In 1080 when the Normans were still compiling the Domesday Book, the church was reconstructed from local sandstone.

Traces of the ancient building are still clearly visible, especially in the large archway in the south wall of the present chancel.



#### Nottingham Leads the Way with Pioneering Service

Support have launched a new specialist team to help improve care for patients with secondary brain tumours across the East Midlands

The service is the first of its kind in the region and has been funded by Macmillan who have invested £500K of fundraised income as part of the Macmillan Cancer Partnership in Nottinghamshire.

A specialist brain metastases team including doctors, nurses and radiographers will meet weekly, to discuss and assess the needs of a patients referred to this service who have been diagnosed with cancer that has spread to the brain. The team will then provide an individual holistic care plan for these patients. This month, healthcare professionals and commissioners from across the region attended the launch lunch held at City Hospi-

tals, radiotherapy building.
Judy Christian, Oncology Consultant said: "This new service is part of our evolution in caring for our patients with brain metastases. It is a novel, high quality, multi-disciplinary service, delivering patient-centre care closer to home, for patients in the region. The service will provide easy access for patients and

easy referrals for our partners across the East Midlands, as they refer patients to the team."

There is currently no service within the East Midlands that is solely dedicated to the needs of patients with Brain Metastases, and around 200 patients are expected to benefit from the input of this new multi-disciplinary team by 2019.

Sue Sanderson, Macmillan Partnership Manager for Notting-hamshire, said: "There has been a huge gap in care for people with brain metastases with no dedicated support anywhere in the East Midlands. It's one of the key ambitions of the Macmillan Cancer Partnership in Nottinghamshire to address these gaps. We're so thrilled to be able to say that people affected by secondary brain tumours will now have access to high quality care closer to home.



Six large privately operated waste and donation points across the borough are to be audited after it was found that one of the bin owners have gone bust and hadn't notified the council that they were no longer emptying the bins. Aylesford Newsprint,

who asked for donations of newspaper, paper and magazines, had gone into liquidation without notifying the council that they would no longer empty the containers leaving the bins inaccessible and overflowing creating an eye sore in the areas.

The large bin sites in Carlton, Netherfield, Mapper-

ley and Colwick have been in place for a number of years and were installed before kerbside collections and charity door to door donations collecwere introduced. tions In recent years, the sites have become spots for the dumping of waste and fly tipping. The audit, due to be carried out later this month, will aim to find out how often the bins are used and what alternatives are in place for residents if they are removed.

Gedling Borough Council provides a kerbside collection for electrical items. large waste and there are a number of council en-

dorsed initiatives such as Sharewear and Trent Vineyard who take clothes donations.

Leader of Gedling Borough Council, Councillor John Clarke said;

"These sites haven't been looked at for a very long time and have become an eye sore. It's important we offer recycling facilities and opportunities for people to help others through donations however, these centres are no longer the best way to do it. We need to do something about the state they have been left in, they look dirty, out of date and are a potentially dangerous fire hazard."

#### **Education improving in Nottingham**

Education standards are improving across Nottingham thanks to the dedicated work of teachers and schools, and with the support of the city's Education Improvement Board. This has led to real improvements in standards of reading in city primary schools. In primary mathematics, city schools are now in the top third of all schools nationally.

Other key achievements include:

- The proportion of young children reaching a good level of development in 2017 was 66.1% - above the national average
- The proportion of pupils attaining the reading, writing and mathematics benchmark in 2017 was 57% - an increase of 7%
- · Outcomes in mathematics were

close to national figures in 2017 and 2016.

The Education Improvement Board is made up of city leaders and education professionals, who have a long-term vision and plan for Nottingham to deliver a world-class education service which serves its young people and families. The board's ten-year programme looks

at improving education in the city.
One of the purposes of the

Education Improvement Board is to help bring key partners in the city's schools together, while promoting improvement activity in city schools and academies. The Board is focusing around the five strands of improving:

- Provision for literacy
- Provision for mathemat-
- · Provision for science
- The retention and re-cruitment of teachers and other school staff
- Transition between the city's primary and secondary schools.

  Most of the improvement

work promoted by the board involves working directly with teachers in their classrooms to improve the quality of learning taking place.

The city's head teachers, teachers and school staff are working hard and effectively to improve outcomes for Nottingham's children. The Education Improvement Board is using its evaluation of school performance data to target work for improvement where it's most needed.

The performance of city secondaries is improving more slowly than the primaries. Overall outcomes, including progress, remain

well below average with Nottingham ranked 145th out of 150 local authorities. In some academies, there are marked discrepancies between the low progress of disadvantaged students and the better progress of other students. Professor Sir David Greenaway, Chair of the Education Improvement Board, said: "The EIB is here to bring together ideas about how we can provide the best possible education for every child and young person in Nottingham.

"Working collaboratively has brought some real improvements in the city. The hard work of the schools, supported by the board, has resulted in some better outcomes this

"However, we still have a long way to go and a tough journey ahead of us. I am confident we can work together to share our strengths to address the challenges currently facing education in Nottingham "

With the 17 new projects focusing on secondary improvement, the aim is to see real change. Every child in Nottingham deserves to go to a good school and by everyone working together we can make this a reality.






