Pupils from Haddon Primary School have performed in a concert for their families to continue their fundraising efforts for fellow pupils in Uganda.

Intrepid Head Teacher, Nina Capek, said the fundraising began after she visited The Lit-tle Angels Orphanage and School in Uganda during the summer break: "I was backpacking around Kenya, Uganda and Rwanda. This included lots of safaris and gorilla tracking, but whenever I go anywhere I try to do some voluntary work or at least visit local communities and get off the tourist trail." Nina says that a startling lack of resources at the school didn't mean that a passion for learning was missing: "Little Angels is for orphaned children from around the Lake Bunyoni area in Uganda. The children are all transported to school by boat. The classrooms were very, very, bare and basic and the teachers were doing everything they could to support the children. The children were all taught in English despite it not being their first language."

Nina said she was sure that the children and families of her Carlton school would want to support and share experiences with the Ugandan school "The children: which thing struck me was how happy they were with so little, and much they wanted to learn. It made realise how fortunate we are and perhaps

we don't always appreciate

'So as soon as I returned I shared photos and discussed what could be done with the rest of the school staff. We decided to work together to both teach our children about other cultures, look at the similarities and differences, and help the African children learn about the UK and support them at the same time. I spoke to the teachers at the school and

asked about the possibility of setting up a link between children and theirs, and that is what we have done!"









Staff from Nottingham Hospital's Emergency Department provided free training in giving CPR and how to deal with choking and burns during the teachathon in Nottingham city centre.

Hospital staff were joined by East Midland's Ambulance Service and Base 51, a Nottingham base counselling service, offering advice and information about their services.

Tessa Jones, Children's Emergency Department (ED) nurse said dozens of people took part in the event, walking away with vital new skills. "We were inspired to set up this event from what we see at work on a day to day basis. "We wanted to educate the public in some basic first aid that will give parents the confidence to act, should an

emergency happen." Emergency Department nurses carried out CPR and choking child demonstrations as well as providing specialist information and advice on burns and basic first aid.

Sian Palmer-Abbott, 16, from Hucknall, attended the event with her younger sister and said: "It has been brilliant. CPR is such a good skill to learn because it can happen to anyone

New Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) have come into force since 20 October in Nottingham. providing Nottingham's 100 Community Protection Officers (CPOs) with the powers they need to deal with street drinkers and keep the city safer.

The new PSPOs will cover the whole of the city of Nottingham from the city centre to suburbs like Clifton, Wollaton and Bulwell and crucially, our Community Protection Officers will now have the power to fine offenders £70 - previously only police officers were able to fine.

Under the new order, a Community Protection Officer can:

- · Require a person not to consume
- Require a person to surrender any alcohol in his/her ossession
- Dispose of the alcohol • Issue a fine of £70
- The new order will help tackle anti-

social behaviours associated with street drinking, including vomiting, urinating and defecating in public areas, littering, violence, aggressive or intimidating behaviour and criminal damage.

When a CPO intervenes in those cases, the street drinker will be asked to stop drinking and surrender their alcohol - if the street drinker complies with those instruc-

tions, they won't receive a fine.

If the street drinker fails to comply - they will receive a fine of £70. If the fine isn't paid, they can be taken to court and given a higher fine of up to £500.

People with various illnesses and conditions could qualify for help as part of Mansfield District Council's Warm Homes on Prescription programme which s for people who live in their own home or privately rented accommodation.

Assistance offered depends on the financial means and health of the occupant and can include

- Grants for boiler repairs, replacement, or
- Help to make heating more affordable, such as guidance on switching energy supplier, ensuring all benefits are claimed, and using heating
- Advice on keeping warm and safe.

People with heart, blood pressure, respiratory and circulation problems, osteoporosis (brittle bones), strokes, diabetes and cancer can seek this support. The council can also negotiate with landlords to secure energy efficiency improvements to privately rented properties, subject to a property assessment. According to Government statistics, 4,395 households in Mansfield - 9.6% of all homes in the district - are fuel poor. Fuel poverty and low incomes are more prevalent in the private rented sector with 19% of households being fuel poor. Properties in this ector are also more likely to have poor energy ef-

Loans will typically be for between £25,000 and £150,000 on a repayment scheme of between six months and three years.

If you are an established business employing people and have an ambition for growth requiring more people that you unable to fund through a bank the loan fund team would be pleased to consider your business plan.

The interest rate charged will reflect the risk profile of the business, but will be around the commercial rate charged by the high street banks with suitable security for the loan. There will also be a small arrangement and monitoring fee.

Are you looking for support of between £5k and £25k for an early stage business?

If your business falls short of the above requirements, or for other support available to provide start up and early stage support you may be able to apply for a Pathfinder Loan managed through the same panel of professionals.

Pathfinder loans of between £5,000 to £25,000 are based on the stage of the business and purpose of the loan. The loan will be released based on agreed milestones and through agreement with the loan panel.





Broxtowe Changes
