



#### Charity single for young brain tumour patient Poppy

A charity single has been released in honour of a young Nottingham brain tumour patient who featured on last year's BBC 'Hospital' show

Five-year-old Poppy McGill, from Arnold, won the hearts of the nation when she was featured in the documentary last vear as she battled a serious brain tumour. She is now recovering well, and features in the video for the new single 'Stand Up and Shine', which was written and produced by her dad Steve McGill.

The song features local musicians including Scott Bugg, as well as Poppy's brain surgeon Donald MacArthur, Paediatric Neurosurgeon at Nottingham Children's Hospital, on saxophone.

The single, which is now available on iTunes and Spotify, is raising money for the Big iMRI Appeal. The appeal is run by Nottingham Hospitals Charity and aims to raise £1.6million for an intra-operative MRI scanner to be used during children's brain tumour surgery at Nottingham Children's Hospital, where Poppy is treated.

Poppy's dad Steve explained: "Really it was down to Donald MacArthur that we appeared on the BBC Hospital programme, as well as the life-saving, amazing surgical job he did with our daughter. Of course we'd do anything to support any appeal he's involved in and we know the Big iMRI Appeal is a big deal to him. Being a professional musician the idea of a charity single came quite naturally."

Talking about his involvement in the charity single, Donald MacArthur said: "Steve and I had talked about the fact we are both musicians when I first looked after Poppy last year and when he asked me if I'd be keen to play on the single I was very happy to do so. She's doing very well now and it was great to be doing something together that celebrates this.

#### More than 150 lives saved thanks to Nottingham donors

ceived life-saving organ transplants courtesy of donors from Nottingham in the past year.

Outside of London, the city of Nottingham has the highest number of donors in the UK with 63 families consenting to their loved ones becoming an organ donor. This resulted in 48 donors proceeded to become a donor and ensured at more than 150 people received lifesaving organ transplants.

Dr Dale Gardiner, Critical Care Consultant at Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust (NUH) and National Clinical Lead for Organ Donation, said: "We need more people in Nottingham to talk about organ donation to increase the number of lifesaving transplants.

"While most people agree that it is important to talk to their family about organ donation, it is less likely that they will have actually had this important conversation.
"Sadly, many opportu-

nities are lost every year because families don't know if their loved one wanted to be a donor or not. Please don't wait. Speak to your family about organ donation today." Next year, the law

is changing in England. From spring 2020, all adults in England will be considered as having agreed to donate their own organs when they die unless they record a decision not to donate or are in one of the excluded

In the lead up to the change in law, NHS Blood and Transplant is urging families across England to talk about their organ donation decision, with the campaign message 'Pass it on'. Even after the law has changed, families will continue to be approached before or-

gan donation goes ahead. Knowing what their relatives want helps families support their decision at a difficult time. Find out more and register your decision by visiting NHS Organ Donor Register at www.organdonation.nhs. uk and share your decision with your family.



#### Volunteers are a cut above

The Leader of Nottingham City Council has thanked local businesses, charities, faith groups and volunteers who helped provide free lunches for vulnerable children this summer.

A number of community initiatives took place in Nottingham over the school summer holidays in a bid to tackle holiday hunger, activity and

isolation among children. Volunteers based at Clifton Young People's Centre in Green Lane, Clifton, packed the lunches before teams transported them around Nottingham to free summer holiday activity days and children's centres.

Nottingham Citizens Forum and Lenton Baptist Church provided further support, while the local business community and voluntary sector rallied around and donated:

- 30 fresh loaves of bread a day from Iceland
- 500 refillable water bottles from Boots
- 200 refillable water bottles from Nottingham Forest

- £250 towards supplies from staff at Sytner Volkswagen Contact Centre
- Sandwich fillings and fruit through the FareShare charity that works with supermarkets to prevent food waste going to landfill
- Snacks from staff at Nottingham City Council's Loxley House headquarters
- Nottingham Catering supported with staff time as well as water, fruit and snacks
- Wilford Co-op collected donations from customers

Hundreds of thousands of youngsters are affected by holiday hunger across the country. While many children from low-income families are entitled to free school meals during term-time, there is currently no such provision during holidays.

Councillor David Mellen, Leader of Nottingham City Council, said: "I'd like to say a huge thank you evervone who worked so hard this summer to provide free food and activities to children in the city.

#### Tourism growth for county

New statistics have revealed that tourism and the wider visitor economy in Nottinghamshire saw an impressive growth in 2018.

The latest Scarborough Tourism **Economic Activity** Monitor (STEAM) report, which provides data for 2018, revealed the value of tourism to the city and county increased by an impressive 4.9% on the previous year, up to £1.903bn from

£1.814bn in 2017. The data revealed that the average spend per trip in Nottinghamshire had risen by 4.5% to £52.84 compared to £50.54 in 2017. The number of visitors to Nottinghamshire also increased by 0.3% to 36.01 million, up from 35.89 million in 2017. This means that overall there were more visitors to Nottinghamshire and each of them spent more during their trip

than the previous year,

providing a dual strong boost to the local visitor economy.

The number of overnight visitors also increased by an impressive 3.1% from the previous year, whilst the average spend during their stay increased by 3.4%. Overnight visitors are particularly valuable to the visitor economy: not only do they boost the accommodation sector, they are also more likely to visit additional attractions

and restaurants during their stay than a day visitor, benefiting the wider visitor economy.

Nottingham City demonstrated strong growth in several areas. with the overall value of tourism rising by 4.5% to £656.91m, and the average spend per trip rising by 3.9% to £56.24. The value of overnight stays in the city - including those who were visiting friends and relatives also increased by 4.8% to £266.51m.



#### LECTURER SHORT-LISTED FOR MAJOR AWARD



A forensic science lecturer from Nottingham Trent University (NTU) has been shortlisted for a national teaching award.

Andy O'Hagan, who teaches in the School of Science and Technology, has been shortlisted in The Times Higher Education (THE) Awards 2019 in the Most Innovative Teacher of the Year category. The award recognises staff whose imagination and passion have transformed a course and inspired students.

Andy, who has been working at NTU since 2010, uses inventive and hands-on teaching methods to bring his lectures to life and inspire students. Before coming to NTU, he gained 31 years of policing experience, working his way up to the role of detective sergeant on the Nottinghamshire Police Serious and Organised Crime Unit. He also worked undercover in covert policing in the UK, the Netherlands, and Poland. # Council is granted court injunction

Gedling Borough Council has been granted an injunction by the courts that bans any unauthorised encampments within the borough.

The council's legal team put a case to Nottinghamshire County Court who granted the injunction, the first of its kind in Nottinghamshire, banning anyone from setting up an unauthorised encampment within Gedling Borough.

The injunction means that anyone who sets up an unauthorised encampment within the borough can be held in contempt of court, liable to imprisonment, fined or have assets seized. The court granted the injunction until the end of October.

The council has previously had success in the removal of unauthorised encampments through action under common law as landowners, using private bailiffs and court orders, however, this is the first time the council has successfully been able to gain an injunction that covers the entire borough.

Leader of Gedling Borough Council, Councillor John Clarke said: "We are really pleased that the courts have finally granted us this injunction that bans illegal encampments across the borough. Evicting illegal encampments, unfortunately, is not as simple as it should be. There is a legal process that is required to take place and, as a council, we are very limited with the powers we have available to evict occupiers. It's frustrating for us and it's frustrating for residents. Our legal team have done a fantastic job at finding new ways to get eviction orders that we can use across the borough. We will continue to challenge any unauthorised encampments and remove them as quickly and efficiently as possible."

#### Retford's latest town improvement revealed

A new mural designed by local artists and children, is the latest in a series of improvements which aims to put Retford even more firmly on the map.

The new 36-ft Canal Heritage Mural forms part of an investment worth more than £45,000 designed to highlight some of the town's historical features, improve the environment and boost tourism

Nottinghamshire County Council is contributing half of the project costs (£22,638) after a successful

bid for Local Improvement Scheme funding by Retford Business Forum, This is being match-funded by Bassetlaw District Council.

The mural, which features an illustrative history of the Chesterfield Canal in Retford, was created by local artist Jenny King and other local artists from Art Tempo, school children from Ordsall Junior school and Retford Rainbows.

Six heritage information boards have also been installed along the Chesterfield Canal through Retford, giving more detailed information of canal's fascinating history.

The need for improved directional signage and information throughout the town was highlighted as part of a Signage Strategy, commissioned by the district council and supported by Retford Business Forum and Retford Civic Society.

The signage in the town centre will also form an extension to the signposting and station improvement scheme which is being funded by an LNER Community Fund Grant to improve access to the Retford Train Station.

The wider signage scheme is expected to be complete by the end of the year.





# Councils given extra £1.5bn funding for social care

Nottinghamshire County Council has welcomed the significant increase in funding for local authorities revealed in the Chancellor of the Exchequer's Spending Review.

An additional £1.5bn has been pledged for adults' and children's social care including £1 billion direct from central government, as well as the continuation of £2.5bn of temporary social care grants and £700m for special educational needs, which is an 11% increase on last year.

"It will help to ensure older people and disabled people can live the lives they want to lead and it will support our most vulnerable young people."

Councillor Kay Cutts, Leader of Nottinghamshire County Council, said: "This is the biggest increase in spending power for local government in a decade and will help councils to meet the rising cost and demand pressures they face in 2020/21.

"We've been lobbying government for some time on the provision of extra funding for social care and I'm delighted that this Government has recognised the pressures we face.

"This new funding will help us continue to provide the social care services needed by Nottinghamshire residents.

"It will help to ensure older people and disabled people can live the lives they want to lead and it will support our most vulnerable young people."

The new funding is a one year grant effective from April 2020.

Lincoln Castle is a major Norman building constructed during the late 11th century by William the Conqueror. It houses a Victorian prison and chapel and a medieval wall walk and offers a fascinating glimpse into the past.

The Museum of Lincolnshire Life is a free to enter attraction also based in Lincoln. It celebrates the county's rich and varied history and its people from 1750 to present day. Exhibits illustrate commercial, domestic, agricultural, industrial and community life. The museum is also home to an authentic World War One called Daphne. There are also interactive galleries featuring the Royal Lincolnshire Regiment which have won prestigious national awards.


#### 1970s was the best decade for fashion

The County Council initiated and co-ordinated the emergency planning response and Gedling Borough Council and Severn Trent Water attended the site immediately following the event to assist residents.

Councillor Phil Rostance, Vice-Chairman of Communities and Place Committee for Nottinghamshire County Council, said "We know flooding can be devastating for those affected and that's why we are doing such an extensive study to identify how we can improve the flood management systems in place in Arnold to reduce the risk of something like this happening again and to ensure residents' homes and business properties are as protected as possible."





#### Crafty kids plan lunch swaps

Half of crafty school children admit to trading their packed lunch on the 'playground black market'.

A study of 1,000 parents and their kids aged 6-11 has revealed what the youngsters really think about their packed lunches with many swapping items with their friends at school for something tastier.

Seven in 10 parents say the health benefits of their child's lunch box is the most important factor when deciding what to put in it.

Children have other ideas though, as they would most like to see chocolate, crisps and biscuits waiting for them at lunchtime.

Instead, the study conducted by bakery brand Warburtons, revealed the average lunchbox includes a sandwich, a piece of fruit, bag of crisps and a bottle of water.

#### Fines for poor parking outside schools

Nottingham City Council's CCTV vehicle is set to become the latest tool to prevent dangerous and inconsiderate parking outside schools

The CCTV enforcement vehicle, clearly marked with CCTV and City Council logos, will be driven by trained civil enforcement officers.

Anyone caught parking dangerously can be issued with a penalty charge notice of £70, reduced to £35 if paid within 14 days. Footage will be reviewed and an independent officer determines if a parking contravention has occurred. If a parking contravention has occurred a PCN is sent to the address of the registered keeper/owner/hirer of the vehicle. This will be sent by post within 28

days of the date of the alleged parking contravention. This will be accompanied by photographic evidence of the parking contravention. Portfolio Holder for Transport, Cllr Adele Williams, said: "The situation outside schools at dropping off and picking up times is a constant source of concern and frustration for us, our schools and

local residents. Poor driving and parking too often places children at serious risk of harm and causes problems for local residents and other road users. We will not hesitate to issue fines to parents whose inconsiderate motoring habits place children and others at risk, as part


