

A Nottingham-based charity that was set up to help bereaved parents of stillborn babies and early baby loss has announced plans to create a Memorial Garden in the city to provide a place of focus, relaxation and reflection for families.

The Forever Stars Memorial Garden is being created at Highfields Park, a short distance from the Queen's Medical Centre and is expected to include areas for reflection, a picnic area, a nature walk and a tree of tranquillity where the names the babies and children can be inscribed upon the

leaves.

Forever Stars was set up by Richard and Michelle Daniels after their daughter Emily was stillborn in December 2013 at the city's Queen's Medical Centre. The charity has already has raised more than two hundred and fifty thousands of pounds to create 'serenity suites' at the QMC and more

recently, the City Hospital. The suites are there to offer a quiet place for parents to reflect, grieve, and spend time with their baby after stillbirth. However, with those more immediate places for reflection

now secured and benefiting 150 families everv year in the city, Forever Stars wants to create lasting public space for families

that will provide a place of focus, relaxation and reflection for families outside of the hospitals.

Richard Daniels explains: "Our 'Forever In Bloom' campaign is a very ambitious step forward for Forever Stars but one that we are proud and excited to be making. The bereavement suites have provided vital immediate comfort and support to grieving families but we feel there is also a need to provide a more lasting space for reflection outside of the hospitals.

"There are memorial gardens all over the world and the UK for various wonderful causes but we don't have one here in Nottingham for baby loss and we want to change that. We have been able to do so much already with the incredible support we have had and now we need to make the next step for families."

Councillor Dave Trimble, Portfolio Holder for Leisure and Culture at Nottingham City Council said: "We are delighted to be able support this very worthwhile local charity. The creation of this beautiful reflective garden is a great addition to Highfields Park and will benefit many families as well as the wider community." Work on the The Forever Stars Memorial Garden is expected to commence from autumn 2018 and will be completed in three phases over 5 years, the Lake phase, the Nature Walk phase and the Community area phase. The total costs will be approximately £1,000,000.

A para-triathlete who defied the odds to become a two-times world champion is encouraging people across Nottinghamshire to take on their own lifechanging challenge in aid of a county hospice.

Steve Judge, who feared he might never walk again after his right leg was partially amputated following a near-fatal car accident in 2002, appealed for intrepid volunteers at the launch of Nottinghamshire Hospice's Be A Hospice Hero cam-

paign. Steve is the official ambassador for the campaign, which is aiming to raise £50,000 for the hospice, in Woodborough Road, by inviting people to

up for a series of sponsored challenges, including skydives, running events and trekking up mountains and along the Great Wall of Chi-

There are 10 challenges in

which is the biggest line-up the hospice has ever assembled. It follows a hugely successful 2017 campaign, when it smashed its target to raise £27,000 of the £2.7m it needs to run the hospice every year. Steve, from Sheffield, now

makes his living as a motivational speaker and says that the charity is looking for people who want to make 2018 the year they step out of their comfort zone and raise money for a good cause all at the

same time.

He said: "In my work
I talk a lot about how achieving personal goals can change your life and taking on a challenge like this is an excellent way

for anybody to experience that.

"So many people would love to do these kind of challenges and think they're beyond them, but they are just the sort of people we want to hear from. The idea of jump-

ing out of a plane or running a marathon might sound crazy now, but they should just go for it by signing up and leave thinking about how they're going to achieve it until later!

"I know from my own life what you can achieve if you set your mind to it and I'm confident that this year's volunteers will find that out for themselves too, while raising lots of money for a wonderful cause among the way.

The Bishop of Sherwood will pull the first pint at Hucknall Beer Festival – a new brew named after him.

The Rt Revd Tony Porter will serve up a pint of Bishop Tony Porter's Porter a dark style of beer - to the first lucky customer at the John Godber Centre on Friday 16 February.

The porter has been brewed by the Lincoln Green Brewing Company, which is based in Wigwam Lane, Hucknall.

Director Anthony Hughes said: "It is a strong, slightly sweet porter with flavours of chocolate malt and the distinctive hop flavour from Sorarchi Ace. We think this unusual hop, originally developed in Japan, imparts a coconut flavour so it's almost a naturally flavoured liquid Bounty.

"We're proud to support Hucknall Beer Festival and the John Godber Centre and are particularly delighted to have brewed



and worked with Head Brewer Martin Castledine to mix the ingredients for the beer, filling a hopper with different types of malt which were then transferred into a large stainless steel tank for the first stage of the brewing process. Bishop Tony said: "I admire people who

start their own business and employ people, and so want to support the Lincoln Green Brewing Company. I'll leave the tasting to others, though – my dad taught me not to drink and drive."

Lincoln Green Brewing Company has brewed various festival specials before but the idea for this one came from Ian Raynor, former Church Warden of St Mary Magdalene Church, whose Church Hall is the John Godber Centre.

The event was organised by PSHE and Citizenship Co-ordinator, Alice Carlisle: "We wanted our young people to explore some highly controversial topics in a safe space, supported by experts, in a carefully planned, thought provoking series of workshops. The students had the opportunity to learn about hate crime, islamophobia, extremism, terrorism, radicalisation and prejudice during the event. They were encouraged to speak openly and ask questions, whilst taking care not to offend anyone.

"We heard many personal stories

and students, some which were not always easy to listen to, but which helped all develop a deeper understanding of the underlying issues and impact on people's lives. The spirit of the day was captured well by one student who said, 'Our generation should be educated about things like this in order to create a peaceful, tolerant society' This is something we are committed to as a school and we hope to have more events like this in the future.'

"I think hearing my story first hand may have shocked some students, especially at the level of fear and anxiety these attitudes can create. I hope my story shines a light on a difficult subject and I think these are conversations we need to have, in order to effect a change for

Lee Scondis, of 'Hope not hate' charity says students need to develop a sense of critical thinking when responding to stories in the media. "We must all learn to scrutinise news articles and think for ourselves, so our workshops looked at bias in reporting, especially across media outlets."



# Trust Tops National Table When it Comes to Research Recruitment

Sherwood Forest Hospitals has been named as top recruiter in the country for the United Kingdom Frozen Shoul-

The latest medical trial that the Trust is running is to help patients with frozen shoulder, a painful and debilitating condition causing stiffness and disability in the affected shoulder and arm. It affects around 1 in 12 men and 1 in 10 women of working age, causing interference with their work, domestic and leisure activities.

Treatment in hospital may involve, physiotherapy, manipulation under anaesthesia or arthroscopic capsular release (ACR) which is a keyhole technique, followed by manipulation to confirm restoration of range of motion in the shoulder.

Although all three of these treatments are regularly provided in the NHS, it is not currently known which one works best. The aim of the study is to answer the question: 'Should adult patients with a frozen shoulder receive a programme of early structured physiotherapy, manipulation under anaestheThe study aims to change best practice within the NHS and offer all patients the same treatment and care.

The study, funded by the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR), will measure improvements in participants' pain, function and general well-being at 3, 6 and 12 months following their entry into the trial. The study will also assess any problems or complications that may arise following these treatments.

Patients from both King's Mill Hospital and Newark Hospital will be taking part in the study, with 47 patients being recruited.

Research Team Leader, Dominic Nash said: "The trial would not have been a success without the help of nursing and clinical staff across the Trust. It was a truly collaborative effort and the success of this trial will lead to even stronger associations with the trial sponsor (South Tees Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust) and more studies being open at Sherwood Forest Hospi-







# The UK's first Affordable E-Motorbike Arrives in Nottingham

motorbike has officially launched in the UK and is expected to reinvent British urban mo-

The Super Soco has been specifically developed to revitalise urban mobility and commuting while reducing emissions and noise pollution. The new e-motorbikes, designed and manufactured in China, are the result of a joint venture between Australian electric scooter company V-Moto and a \$15m Chinese crowd funded project.

The new 'Super Soco' electric motorbike is now available at Midland Scooter Centre, Nottingham, and promises to transform the morning commute of environmentally-conscious urbanites.

The emotorbikes combine the latest zeroemission electric scooter technology with the sleek design and striking visuals of a motorbike, making the Super Soco the perfect option for urban riders and commuters looking for fast, fun and emission-free mobility. Not only does Super Soco's stylish design set it apart from other urban electric motorbikes and scooters, state-of the art features include keyless start, anti-theft alarm and wheel locking, lightweight carbon steel mainframe and intelligent LED speedometer.

A removable lithium battery (which can be recharged at any domestic 13amp socket or at on-street chargers) and a rear wheel-integrated Bosch motor combine to help provide improved pick-up and acceleration compared to petrol 50cc bikes. The machine is set to a restricted maximum speed of 28mph and is able to travel approximately 40 miles per charge with maximum torque of 120NM. Costing just £2,349 (inclusive of VAT and government grant), the bikes are being sold nationwide in key cities including Nottingham, London, Manchester and Birmingham. http://supersoco.co.uk



with £1.4m plans to give one of its most historic buildings in the district a significant revamp as part of wider plans to regenerate the town cen-

The aim is reopen the Old Town Hall by transforming the ground floor into indoor retail units and the upper floors into offices, bringing the building back into full use by early 2019 for the first time in more than 30 years.

It is one of the flagship projects in a wider council "place shaping" strategy to breathe new life into the town centre and raise the profile of the district as somewhere to invest in, shop, visit and live.

The council has earmarked over £733,000, fifty per cent of the total cost of the work, to bring the Old Town Hall back into public use.

The Town Hall proposals include completing the renovation to the main council chamber and grand stairs. The work will also improve the accessibility of the Grade II listed building by providing level access and improved toilet fa-cilities to the public areas of the building as well as fully accessible offices.

It is anticipated the retail units could attract, for

example, craft and artisan businesses, which would help enhance the town centre as a shopping destination for both residents and visitors. The offices on the upper floors, occupying a

prestige location in the town centre, will be let. To enable the internal and external alterations to allow the building to be renovated and repurposed, an application to grant listed building consent has been supported by the council's Planning Applications Committee after consultation with Historic England, the public body which champions England's historic environ-

It is currently with the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government for further consideration but is expected to get the go-ahead.
