Nottingham will welcome prospective Tokyo Olympians to the city next summer for the inaugural Accenture World Triathlon Mixed Relay Nottingham as the ITU announce their global Mixed Relay Series.

The evening event is set to take place on Thursday 7 June and will witness some of the world's top triathlon quartets dive into the River Trent, before racing around Victoria Embankment on both bike and foot, just two days before they head north to take on the British leg of the ITU World Triathlon







Students Launch 2018 Calendar to Challenge Perceptions of Homelessness

Following the successful launch of the Stories of the Streets photography exhibition, which showcases images of homelessness from the perspective of those experiencing it first-hand, students are launching a 2018 calendar to support Nottingham's homeless community.

The calendar will retail at £10 and is available to purchase at the exhibition in the intu Broadmarsh Shopping Centre, and online at www.peopleofthestreets.co.uk

With the support of local homeless centres Emmanuel House and Canaan Trust, volunteers from the homeless community were provided with a personal disposable camera, enabling them to share their stories with others. Proceeds from the calendars will be reinvested back into the social enterprise to help support more homeless people this winter in addition to help with further exhibitions across the UK.

Denis Tulley, CEO of Emmanuel House, says: "Clearly the exhibition is evocative and power in the images it portrays. You can see this not just in the comments people have written in response to what they have seen. This is an important project which contributes

to overcoming the stigma and restoring the humanity we don't often see because someone is homeless. The exhibition challenges us to 'think again."

Managing Director, Charles Kerr says: "Lots of people have come into the exhibition to look at the photos, give donations, educate themselves and share their thoughts about homelessness in our city. This calendar will give the people of Nottingham yet another opportunity to show their support and enjoy the beauty of these images.'

Alex Greenhalgh, Operations Director adds: 'The exhibition runs until Christmas, and the response from local people has been amazing. However, homelessness is an issue all year round. We hope the calendar will keep people engaged well beyond the physical exhibition itself."

Stories of the Streets is organised by People of the Streets CIC, a student-led initiative organised by University of Nottingham students Charles Kerr. Oas Hussain and Alex Greenhalgh, with support from Boots and SIG. People of the Streets is based in Nottingham.

The University of Nottingham staged a day-long take-over at the school in Firbeck Road to inspire learning and promote the subjects that impact our daily lives.

Engineering was taught by getting pupils to mix different amounts of ingredients to form 'concrete' before carrying out a num-

Concrete is a great example because they can see it all around them. And of course we need a new generation of engineers of all different types to meet the challenges that the modern world continues to throw up."

Meanwhile maths was covered with magnetic pendulums, Newton's cradles, gyroscopes and the Towers of Hanoi puzzle Wendy Riley, Deputy Head teacher at Firbeck Academy, said: "We are very lucky to work closely with the University to raise aspirations and show our children what a wide variety of amazing careers they could have in the future. This special WOW day introduced the children to STEM in a hands on, interactive way and I'm sure inspired them to go on to study science, technology, engineering or maths!'

The interest rate charged will reflect the risk profile of the business, but will be around the commercial rate charged by the high street banks with suitable security for the loan. There will also be a small arrangement and monitoring fee.

Are you looking for support of between £5k and £25k for an early stage business?

If your business falls short of the above requirements, or for other support available to provide start up and early stage support you may be able to apply for a Pathfinder Loan managed through the same panel of professionals.



Bus Users Being Short-Changed

to ensure the cheapest bus tickets are promoted via its mobile app, says Nottingham City Councillor Toby Neal

NCT introduced the ability to pay for tickets via the app in December 2016. However, almost a year on, the app still doesn't include the two cheapest ticket options, the Short Hop and the Inner City Return, for people to buy. The bus company has previously been criticised for failing to adequately promote its Short Hop tickets.

The cheapest single journey available on the app is £1.90 and the cheapest return is £3.50. But there are two cheaper fares that people can choose. A Short Hop journey is available for £1.30 within a fare stage (up to 0.5 miles) and the Inner City Return ticket can be purchased by people making short return journeys to and from the City Centre and costs just £2.40.

Councillor Toby Neal, the Council's Portfolio Holder for Community and Customer Services, said: "NCT is making a good job of giving the impression that they don't want people to know about the cheapest tickets available so they will buy a more expensive one.

"Unfortunately, the people most affected by this are likely to be the least well off who rely on the bus to travel short distances. They are effectively paying more per mile than they

"Customers have a right to get the best fare available to them so we've asked NCT to ensure that all its fares, including the cheapest options, appear on the app as a matter of urgency and are effectively promoted elsewhere to ensure people don't continue to short-changed.'

Work on Bespoke Student Flats Is Underway

commercial building in the heart of Nottingham into bespoke student flats, thanks to a deal secured by property consultants Bruton Knowles.

The 2,088 sq. ft. building in Cranbrook Street was recently sold for £320,000 to property developer Harren Invest-ments for conversion into two modern five-bedroom apartments

When completed it will provide ensuite accommodation for 10 students, with redevelopment expected to be finished in time for the start of the 2018/19 academic term.

The empty three-storey property, comprising three floors, eight rooms and a basement, had been used as a printing shop with office space for many years. It was sold due to business relocation. Harry Warren of Harren Investments in Nottingham, said he was very pleased to have purchased the building for redevelopment: "We're always on the lookout for buildings like this with great potential. We recently completed the show flat and we have already fully-pre-let the property for the next

academic year.
"We're glad to have found this property and we're grateful to Sam at Bruton Knowles for all his help in securing it for us and supporting us through planning regulations."

Sam Spencer, associate at Bruton Knowles in Nottingham, agreed the deal; securing a lease for 12 months to allow the new owner time to obtain planning permission, followed by the sale of the freehold.

Sam said: "We've seen a huge rise in the conversion of commercial to residential property across the city, and we have been involved in a number of cases where we have been able to give sound advice and support with planning permission approvals. In this case we supported the proposed classification change from B1 use to C4.

"When purchasing commercial property landlords should consider securing planning approval in the early stages and be sure to conduct in-depth research, while safeguarding their position should planning permission not be granted.

Pupil Billie Pendle said that he liked the outdoors. "The willow is good for weaving things out of and I think it's nice to have such a big field to play in." Billie said there were lots of birds in the area. "I think our topic next year might be about animals and nature, so I think this area will be really good to use as an outdoor learning centre!"

New Gastroenterologist Aims To Ease Treatment Side Effects of Cancer Survivors

43,000 people in the East Midlands who are struggling with the long term side effects of cancer treatment, which may appear several years after the actual treatment itself.

Many patients who recover from can-cer are often left with side effects of the treatments which saved their lives. People who receive radiotherapy to combat cancers in the pelvic area, such as cervical, bladder or prostate cancer are the largest group affected as they can be left with bowel problems after

surgery or chemotherapy.
Altogether, there are 170,000 survivors of cancer in the East Midlands. But while they are generally pleased to be rid of the tumours, around a quarter of those – some 43,000 – will be struggling to find useful treatments to help

"It doesn't have to be this way," says consultant bowel specialist Dr Jervoise Andreyev – one of the few doctors researching and treating bowel consequences of cancer treatments. Working for 17 years at the Royal Marsden Hospital in London, Dr Andreyev researched and published widely on the subject of post-cancer

recovery. Now, he has moved his practice to BMI The Park Hospital in Not-tingham and BMI The Lincoln Hospital, treating private patients alongside his research programme at Lincoln County Hospital.

His research has indicated that when patients have successfully beaten can-cer in their pelvic area, 9 out of 10 patients report a long term change in their bowel habit, with half saying it

affects their daily lives and up to one

third saying it



has moderate or severe effects by causing problems with con-

trolling their bowels, diarrhoea, cramps, wind or painful bloating. In addition four out of ten report problems with urination and one in three long term sexual problems

Dr Andreyev uses carefully tailored tests to create individual care options for the patient. This may include very simple interventions such as antibiotics, exercises and dietary changes to much more complex treatments designed to overcome the effect of the scar tissue resulting from the cancer

therapies.
"Everyone's experience and set of symptoms is different and needs a different approach but it is unusual not to be able to make a significant difference," said Dr Andreyev.

John Lindars, Executive Di-

rector at BMI The Park Hospital, said: "We are very fortunate to have Dr Andreyev working with us. His expertise is going to be extremely help-ful for patients in the East Midlands who have undergone successful treatment for their cancer but who are left with side effects from radio-







The Hope Project provides yearround support to dogs' owners who

The project also works with homelessness hostels and day centres to encourage them to accept clients with dogs and helps them put in place practical guidelines to ensure all residents are safe and protected.


- Keep your bedroom window closed at night during cold weather. Breathing in cold air can increase the risk of chest infections.




