

Fantastic Fundraisers From THE COVER **Boast Cycling Success**

The top fundraisers for the city's biggest cycling event were recognised at a special presentation event in Nottingham on Wednesday 28 November.

Cycle Live Nottingham took place on Sunday 24 June 2018, and Nottingham Hospitals Charity is the official three-year charity partner for the event, which is organised by Nottingham-based Perfect Motion.

Over 100 participants took part in aid of Nottingham Hospitals Charity in this year's Cycle Live, cycling a total of more than 5,000 miles, with many supporting the Big Appeal which is raising £4 million over four years for Nottingham

Children's Hospital.

Those taking part included hospital teams, family groups, friends and colleagues. Riders were able to choose between fantastic new routes which offered 25. 50, 75, 100 or 125 mile rides, and raised more than £25,000 for the Charity in total.

Last week a special presentation event was held where prizes were given to the cyclists who raised the most money. These included:

- Richard Gerrard. from Wollaton, who raised £1,355 for the Big Appeal for Nottingham Children's Hospital after hearing about their work
- Dr Andrew Lunn, Paediatric Nephrology Consultant at Nottingham Children's Hospital, who raised £875 for the Big Appeal to help his young patients
- Eight-year-old Lucas Edwards, from Edwinstowe, who completed the 25-mile cycle ride with his dad, Luke Bend. The pair raised £556 for the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, where Lucas was cared for as a baby Each of the top

fundraisers was given a cycling jersey and a photo session at Photo Nottingham, where the celebration event took place.

Luke Bend said: 'When Lucas was born he was a bit poorly and that spurred us on as a family to raise money through various events.

When the time was right, Lucas wanted to give something back too, so we both signed up for the 25 miles at Cycle Live. We had an absolutely great time - it's a lovely family event.

"We will forever be indebted to Nottingham's hospitals, so we will always keep raising money and taking part in Cycle Live.'

Dr Andrew Lunn said: "It's a really fun event and I enjoyed taking part in it. I was inspired to take part in aid of the Big Appeal because it will make such a difference to my patients by providing better parent accommodation for our families who come from as far away as Great

Yarmouth, as well as a more child friendly environment for young patients.

Nigel Gregory, Director of Development at Nottingham Hospitals Charity, said: "The money raised through Cycle Live will make a huge difference to patients being treated at Nottingham's hospitals, especially our young patients at Nottingham Children's Hospital, by providing improvements to ward areas and family accommodation. specialist medical equipment, and vital research."

Prestigious Award for Local Hospitals

The Learning Disabilities team at Sherwood Forest Hospitals are celebrating after scooping a coveted Health Service Journal (HSJ) Award on Wednesday 21 November at the Intercontinental O2 in London.

The HSJ Awards recognise the most outstanding contributions of staff and organisations to the NHS and healthcare, and are the most prestigious healthcare awards in the calendar.

The Learning Difficulties team won in the Enhancing Care by Sharing Data and Information category for their work improving how the Trust cares for some of their most vulnerable patients -

those with learning disabilities and autism.
Suzanne Banks, Chief Nurse for Sherwood Forest Hospitals said: "We are just so proud of the team and the work that they do for our patients with learning difficulties and their families - who we know are amongst the most vulnerable that we come into contact with. Congratulations to the team for this hugely deserved recognition."

REDUCE REUSE

Sherwood Forest Hospitals has been commended for the way the Trust manages its waste after winning a Sustainable Health and Care Award for Waste and Resource management.

The national awards highlight and celebrate the fantastic sustainable development work across the NHS, social care and public sector.

The Trust was recognised for its ground breaking work in waste management, which began in 2014 when the Trust, working alongside partners Skanska, began analysing and improving the Trust's waste management, which involved auditing more than 127,000 waste bins, looking at their location and how staff could be better trained in waste management.

Since the programme began the Trust has shown vast improvements in its waste management, with more than 3600 staff being trained in waste management, resulting in zero amount purposing programme that provides furniture, which reduces the disposal costs. To date 40 tonnes of furniture has been diverted to two charities. Over 1000 pairs of crutches, various walking frames, beds and toilet aids have been shipped to Syria and these will then be distributed amongst Atmeh and Balyoun Hospitals.



Nottinghamshire residents have praised national construction company Willmott Dixon for its commitment to keeping their interests at the heart of the Winwood Heights Retirement Village development. The £12 million scheme

sees the re-development of 180 extra care flats at Woodthorpe and Winchester Court, the demolition of old garages and a community centre to make way for 44 new-build units, a sky lounge, hairdressers and a communal lounge.

One of the key community elements to the project was

the re-development a vital path that links Mapperley to Mansfield Road. This additional infrastructure was not part of the original plan but Willmott Dixon provided this as an added benefit to the community.

Cycle England, a Discover England Fund project led by Visit Lincoln, Access Lincoln and Welcome to Yorkshire, has launched a new grant scheme for tourism businesses so they can get 'cycle ready' in 2019.

The project will create new bookable cycling packages in Lincolnshire and Yorkshire, targeting Dutch and German holidaymakers. Working with Tour Operators the new packages will launch in March 2019 and up to £100,000 has been set aside to help tourism businesses improve facilities for cyclists.

Chief Executive at Visit Lincoln, Lydia Rusling said: "This is a very exciting project to be involved in and will tap into overseas visitor markets that have not been fully explored before. The new packages include three new cycling

routes which highlight the iconic scenery of historic Lincoln, Lincolnshire Wolds and the Humber to the Wash.

"The cycling packages will include accommodation, attraction passes, transport, bike hire and other elements which are needed for a top quality cycling holiday. As part of the overall Cycle England project, grant funding of £100,000 has been set aside to help businesses get 'cycle ready' by improving their facilities; such as cycle parking, storage, changing facilities, route signage and e-bike hire."

VisitEngland Chief Executive Sally Balcombe said: "Cycle England showcases the outstanding locations packaged together on a variety of routes, giving visitors the opportunity to discover the region and experience the cultural and rural charm of the wider area."

One Pot Meals for Busy Families

When it comes to eating healthily at home, you shouldn't need to make a choice between cost, convenience and long term health.

Heart Research UK are always thinking about juggling busy lives while trying to keep a heart healthy lifestyle. To help, they have come up with tips to prepare a healthy meal for the family on those long winter nights using a slow cooker.

Add the ingredients to your pot in a morning, set the timer and come home to the smell of a delicious meal ready to eat

Keep Your Heart Tender You don't need to spend a fortune on joints of meat to keep it tender. Avoid fatty cuts, opt for a low fat choice and add a splash of white wine vinegar or fresh lemon/orange juice - this will help loosen the meat and keep it





Rub It In

Tenderise your meat using a mallet or by giving it a gentle rub; go for herbs and spices which complement the recipe and appeal to your palate without using salt. Gently rubbing with ground ginger and adding crushed pineapple works well for a 'sweet and sour' style. Add some onions, a can of chopped tomatoes and cook on a low heat for 6-8 hours. Pop some frozen veg and bean sprouts in for the last 20 minutes of cooking and voila...a heart healthy pot of goodness.

Too Much Liquid

If you find you have too much liquid and want a thicker sauce, don't be tempted to add high salt stock cubes or coconut milk that is high in saturated fat. You'd be much better creating a 'slurry' of equal amounts (approx.1 tbsp.) of water and corn starch and gently stirring through the liquid towards the end of cooking.

Veggie recipes are wonderful for adding crunch, texture, variety and heart healthy fibre and antioxidants. They also blend well if you want to make leftovers into a soup for the next day. Try a Moroccan style harira, a stew like thickened soup consisting of lentils, chickpeas, spices, passata, coriander, chunky vegetables and vegetable stock.
