



The Nottingham Trent University study is investigating how red squirrels

currently utilise and exploit urban environments
– so that this information can be used to help better manage these habitats to their advantage.

There are thought to be about 140,000 red squirrels left in the UK, with numbers dwindling as a result of being outcom-peted by the hardier grey squirrel, which was introduced from the United States in the late 1800s. Using Formby in Merseyside as their study site – a stronghold for red squirrels - the research-

ers will examine the reds' patterns of movement and their home ranges.

They will also investigate the effects of living in close proximity to humans, such as activities and opportunities for supplementary feeding and hotspots linked to traffic mortality.

The impact upon squirrel populations of the gradual removal of trees nearby residential gardens - a high-quality habitat for the reds – will be studied as part of the four-year project, which Wildlife Trust and National Trust Formby.

The work will involve using tracking technol-ogy to monitor movements in nearby gardens and woods. Questionnaires to volunteers will assess how and when they currently feed the reds and their thoughts on squirrel conservation generally

Any dead red squirrels found during the study will also be tested for disease and cause of death. "We hope that this study







Nottingham city centre student accommodation, Hydrogen has teamed up with Nottinghamshire Police to help keep the city's students, and their

belongings, safe.
Over 50 people attended a recent event at Hydrogen, where students received tips from the Police on how to reduce the risk of becoming a victim of theft and were assisted in logging their mobile phones on to the Immobilise register.

Immobilise is a nationwide property register, that links directly into the database used by the police to track the owners of lost and stolen goods. It is free to use and plays an

important part in deterring criminals and returning items to their rightful owners.

Jonty Green, Head of FHP Student Living, which manages Hydrogen, explained why the partnership is so important to them:

'Students, particularly those that are new to the city, are often seen as easy targets by criminals, but this needn't be the case. Hydrogen has been designed with the safety of its residents in mind, but we also want to help them to look after themselves when they go out. By working with Nottinghamshire Police we hope to raise awareness among our resi-

dents of the potential risks they face and to educate them about the ways that they can look after themselves and their belongings when out and about." Nottinghamshire Police Special Constable, Charlie Flatters

"It is really important that we reach out to safeguard the high volume of students in the city against crimes such as theft, and working with partners like Hydrogen, we can make that happen. The event resulted in more than 50 students signing up to the national database, in addition to taking away more important crime prevention tips.

AS THE WEATHER WARMS UP, Broxtowe Borough Council is urging residents to protect their valuable garden equipment this summer by following some simple garden crime prevention

Power tools, lawn mowers, garden tools and bikes are just some of the expensive equipment left in gardens or stored in unsecured sheds. If stolen some of these items could be used by the intruder to break into your

Effective garden security includes everything from boundary fences, gates, outbuildings and the valuables stored inside

Protect your valuables by following these tips:
• Fit well positioned external

- lighting
- Strong gates, fences and walls kept in good repair can deter intruders from accessing your property, keep gates locked at
- · Compliment security measures, such as lighting, locks

and alarms by planting prickly plants to deter burglars. If doing so it is best to plant these around vulnerable areas such as: windows, fences boundary

- walls and drainpipes Keep your shed in good con-
- Fit a closed shackle padlock to the door fittings should be bolted through the door and any screws concealed
- Fit grilles or mesh to the win-
- Fit a shed alarm
- · Chain large items such as bicycles together - it is more dif-ficult for a thief to carry away a lot of large heavy items all
- · Lock ladders to a secure fixture in the shed or garage so they cannot be used to reach windows in your home
- Mark your garden tools and equipment with your postcode and house name or number
- Don't leave ladders and tools lying around in your garden -these could be used to break into your home



Students at Rushcliffe School, in West Bridgford, have been hearing first-hand the moving story of holocaust survivor Simon Winston.

Simon and his family escaped from a Jewish ghetto in Nazi Occupied Poland during the Second World War and spent nearly two years in hiding, narrowly escaping capture on numerous occasions. After the war his family,

who were then homeless, came to Nottingham and Simon, now 79, has lived in Nottinghamshire

ever since.
240 Year 9 students listened in stunned silence as Simon spoke of how 2000 Jews in the ghetto (prison camp) where he lived as a child were rounded up, marched into the forest and shot dead; of how his father used one of the gold bars, which he had

hidden in secret compartments in clothes, shoes and a brush, to bribe a German soldier into allowing their family to escape; and of how they spent years hid-ing in holes in the ground, only coming out at night to forage for

The talk was the culmination of a year-long "Lessons from Auschwitz" project which the school has been undertaking through



16-year-old Jessica added: "It's really important to learn about things like genocide to make sure it never happens again."

A £1.8m research project being led by the University of Nottingham is investigating whether new guidance for care home staff could be effective in reducing the number of falls experienced by older residents.

Funded with a grant from the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR), the three-year project is recruiting care homes in the East Midlands, West Yorkshire and East Anglia to trial a new guidelines and training package aimed at reducing the incidence of falls.

If the new approach, designed by academics in the University's Division of Rehabilitation and Ageing, is found to be effective in protecting residents from the risk of falls, it could be rolled out to care homes

across the UK

Pip Logan, Professor of Rehabilitation Research, said: "Falls among care home residents place a huge financial burden on the NHS including treatment for broken bones, hip replacement surgery and lengthy hospital stays for recovery.
"In addition, this is an important quality of life is-

"In addition, this is an important quality of life issue for care home residents. Falling can be a very frightening experience for older people and it can often leave residents extremely fearful of a repeat occurrence, leading them to reduce their mobility and losing independence.

"We know that exercise keeps us and our bones healthy so reducing their mobility can actually lead to them becoming increasingly frail over time."








