






During Stoptober Sherwood Forest Hospitals is reminding patients and staff that there is support available at the Trust to help quit smoking. Stoptober is a campaign that runs throughout October to encourage people to quit smoking, based

on research that if you can make it to 28 days smoke free, you are five times

more likely to quit for good. The new Personal Quit Plan recommends a range of options to smokers including face-to-face support. nicotine replacement therapies like patches, gum or inhalers, and e-cigarettes

For more information about Stoptober please contact Smokefree Life Nottinghamshire on 0800 2465343. Smokefree Life Nottinghamshire provide bedside support to help patients remain smoke free and can provide Nicotine Replacement Therapies for free for up to 6 weeks on discharge.

Respiratory Consultant and Chair of the Smokefree steering group for the Trust, Dr John Hutchinson said: "Stoptober is an ideal time for us to remind patients, staff and visitors that we are a smoke free Trust that provides support for people to stop smoking.

"Latest statistics show that out of the 6.1 million smokers in England, 6 in 10 want to quit, but most try to quit using willpower alone despite this being the least effective method. The most successful quit attempts use a combination of effective stop smoking support methods, which is why we are using this approach with our patients and staff at SFH. We are really keen for our hospitals to become truly smoke free. During Stoptober Public Health England are offering people a free online 'Personal Quit Plan' which I would encourage people to download, whilst also getting the right support including advice and nicotine replacement therapy.

Major Funding Boost for Local Air Ambulance

Nottingham based property and construction consultancy Gleeds has played host to its fourth annual Treasure Hunt in the city centre, raising more than £3,600 for the Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire Air Ambulance Charitable Trust.

Fantastic £4m School Expansion

A City special school officially opened its new £4m expansion on 2 October – increasing its provision for children with special educational needs from 45 permanent places to 120 places.

New classrooms, offices and play facilities have been created at Westbury Academy in Chingford Road, Bilborough, which caters for primary and secondary age pupils.



The expansion is part of the City Council's ambitious plan to increase the number of school places in Nottingham, with £42m invested since 2009 to provide 5,000 additional primary places.

Marcus Wells, Principal of Westbury
Academy, said: "Our school continues to make
a difference to our pupils and I am very proud
to see the recognition that we are receiving for
this through the commitment of the council in
funding this development."

Two further expansions are planned for Nottingham as part of the programme – Glade Hill Primary School in Bestwood and Middleton Primary School in Wollaton.



The People's Vote National Day of Action followed on from the hugely successful People's Vote Summer of Action, which saw mass rallies take place all over the country. The People's Vote March for the Future takes place in London on 20 October.



On Thursday 8th November, British Army and German Armed Forces teams will play football matches to mark the centenary and to pay respect to the many men and women who lost their lives during the war. The Games also signify the strong bonds which now exist between the two nations.

Nottingham Forest and Notts County Football Clubs have joined forces with the British Army Football Association to host The Games. With its strong links to football, Nottingham is the perfect place to hold this significant armistice event.

The football-filled day will have something for all ages to enjoy, including youth fan zones; displays of military equipment and vehicles at the football grounds and music from a military band. Emergency patients at Sherwood Forest Hospitals are receiving some of the timeliest care in the NHS figures reveal.

For the second quarter in a row (July, August, September), more than 95% of emergency patients were seen, treated and discharged or admitted within four hours. Despite increasing numbers of attendances year on year, the Trust saw 95.92% of patients within four hours across the quarter, and has now achieved the standard of 95% for five months in a row.

Richard Mitchell, Sherwood Forest Hospitals Chief Executive said: We strive to provide all of our patients with the care we would want members of our family to receive, and timeliness is a good indicator of the overall quality of care.

As a Trust we remain very busy, seeing more than 2,000 more patients in this quarter than we did the previous year, so it is a huge credit to our staff right across our hospitals as well as our partner health and social care organisations that we continue to achieve the emergency care standard.


Spectacular Music Season Closes On a High Note

A tough new blueprint for tackling knife crime in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire has been unveiled for the first time.

The Knife Crime Strategy 2018 is a pan-agency agreement, led by Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner Paddy Tipping, setting out an ambitious plan of action to tackle one of Britain's most serious threats to public safety.

The Strategy will see partners working together with the voluntary sector to tackle every aspect of knife violence with a strong emphasis on education, early intervention and youth engagement.

Backed by Nottingham City Council and Safer Nottinghamshire Board, voluntary and community sector and criminal justice partners the strategy sets out four key areas of work including identification and management of risk, developing resilient spaces, communication and behaviour change and communities and the third sector

Launching the strategy, Mr Tip-

ping said: "Knife crime poses a serious risk to young people today and it is imperative we act now to break down the false attitudes and ideas that convince some that violence is acceptable.

"Offenders need to respect the

"Offenders need to respect the repercussions of carrying a knife in a public place which is why this strategy will involve robust enforcement, especially in our pubs and nightclubs. But they also need to be supported and encouraged to take a new direction and lead more productive lives which this strategy will also deliver.

"We all have a role to play, not just the agencies signed up to this strategy, and we will be making sure parents, youth workers, charities and the wider community understand their responsibilities fully and play a pivotal role in solving this national problem locally."





ematicians' Awards.


"Maths is such an integral part of our everyday lives and having competitions like this really encourages children to see the importance of it and excitement that it can bring.






