# Spruce-up for Forest legend

The statue of the man who masterminded one of Nottingham Forest's most famous moments in their history is to get a spruce-up to mark the 40 anniversary of that success

The legendary Brian Clough, together with his assistant manager Peter Taylor, were at the helm on Wednesday 30 May, 1979, when their Forest side beat Malmo in Munich to lift the European Cup. The club would go on to create more history the following season by defending the trophy in Madrid with another 1-0 victory, this time over German side Hamburger SV.

In honour of the 40th anniversary of the first of these two famous victories, the Brian Clough statue will be given a clean and wax to make sure it is looking at its very best.

Councillor Dave Trimble, Portfolio Holder for Leisure and Culture at Nottingham City Council, said: "We have very many things that make us proud about our city, but right up the top of that list is Forest's successes in the European Cup which really put Nottingham on the map.

"What Brian Clough, Peter Taylor and their players and staff achieved in 1979, and the fact the trophy was retained the year after, will forever be remembered by the club's supporters

"We felt it was fitting that the Brian Clough statue should have a clean and polish in recognition of the 40th anniversary of that first famous victory and for everything that he did for football

The statue was unveiled in King Street more than a decade ago and came about thanks to the hard work and dedication of a small team of volunteers working in partnership with the City Council.

Paul Ellis, the chairman of the Brian Clough Statue Fund which raised the money for the statue, said: "Forty years on from that fantastic achievement in Munich, it's only fitting that Cloughie's statue gets this special attention.'

Nottinghamshire's Flying High Partnership schools came together recently to raise just over £3000 for Rainbows Children's Hospice by sending teams to tackle a challenging Holme Pierrepont based triathlon.

Organiser, Fliss Prior, a teacher at Bilsthorpe Flying High Academy, said the challenge was inspired by her mum's inspirational quest for fitness.

She explained: "After seeing my mum complete her first open water swim at the age of 60 in 2017 in a bid to get fitter, I was determined to get other people to realise that they could do stuff for the first time too, no

matter what age, fitness level or ability.

It prompted Fliss to use a Triathlon to raise money for a number of charities, most recently for Rainbows Children's Hospice - The Flying High Partnership's chosen charity.

She said: "Beginning in 2017 five teams from

schools in the Flying High Partnership raised money for cancer research, followed in 2018 with another five teams from schools and teacher training across the trust where we raised £1000 for Rainbows. But this year, an incredible 14 teams from different schools and teacher training within the trust came together and we raised just over £3000 for Rainbows Hospice.'

Experienced swimmer Fliss, who was the first woman out of the water in the Triathlon, said maybe there will be another event next year: "I want to thank everyone that donated not only their time but to those who donated money for Rainbows. It is such an important cause and if we do it again next year maybe even more people will get involved."

# Three new courts for tennis club

Coun Wheeler said: "Tennis is one of the best activities for all-round fitness and in the age of social media, it is vital we engage young people with exercise and outdoor activities. The club attracts tennis players of all ages and during the tennis season is a real hub of activity.
"There is no better sight than seeing children engag

ing with sport at a young age, and through the club's Outreach programme, there is a thriving junior membership, which every club needs for future growth."

Club secretary and Junior Programme co-ordinator Jill Shelvey said that through the club's Outreach programme, coaching was now offered to ten Rushcliffe primary schools.

# Hoodwinked robins come home to roost in Sherwood

Two robin sculptures have recently taken pride of place in Sherwood after residents clubbed together to buy them at auction to support Nottingham hospice.

The birds formed part of a trail of colourful five-foot robin sculptures that took Nottingham by

storm last summer. They have now come home to roost at their forever perches on Mansfield Road in Sherwood and have been welcomed at an official ceremony.

Fireman Dan Walker set up a crowd-funder which raised more than £7,000 in a week before the Hoodwinked auction last October when sculptures were auctioned to raise funds for the hospice. Dan, cheered on by community members, won two robins for the local community.

# NEWS in brief..

### The end of supermum?

Eight in 10 mums have shunned the idea of being a supermum – and feel they are 'good enough' instead, a study has found.

Researchers polling 2,000 mums of children aged 0-18 for parenting site, ChannelMum, have found that rather than aiming for perfection, most believe they are doing OK when it comes to raising happy and healthy children.

Just managing to produce a cake on time for their child's birthday is among the things mums believe shows that they are doing a 'good enough' job, as well as serving up vegetables for their child at mealtimes, even if they only eat a couple of forkfuls.

Being okay with the fact their youngster isn't getting the best grades in the class, happily playing with the kids instead of doing the washing and understanding it doesn't matter if the meals they prepare aren't cooked from scratch, also feature in the list.

### Sink or swim

Three in 10 adults have not been swimming for more than 10 years, a study has found.

A lack of time, not wanting to have to get changed before and after a swim and being selfconscious in their bathing suits mean millions have not set foot in a public pool for at least a decade.

And another three in every 100 adults have never been swimming in a public pool.

Other reasons for not swimming regularly include not wanting to use public changing rooms, exercising in other ways instead and not feeling confident in the water.

It also emerged one in five adults cannot swim, with a fifth of those now believing it is too late for them to learn.

Another 45 per cent regret not picking it up at a younger age.

The study was commissioned by John West as part of its Get Yourself Shipshape campaign, which aims to encourage people to make 'little and often' changes towards healthy, active lifestyles.

### That festival feeling

One in five music fans would happily ditch their annual holiday – and go to a festival instead, a study has found.

The rising cost of holidays (29%), hotter UK summers (14%) and uncertainties around Brexit (12%) mean many would prefer to enjoy a long weekend of live music instead of heading abroad.

And of those with tickets to a music festival this summer, three in 10 say it is their main trip this year.

It also emerged almost one in five (19%) feel their summer would be 'incomplete' without the atmosphere of a festival field to soak-up.

While 22 per cent opt for a festival over a holiday because it has everything they could want in one place.

The research was commissioned by Barclaycard to celebrate its partnership with Live Nation and AEG, which sees the sponsorship of eight festivals this summer.

Daniel Mathieson, head of sponsorship at Barclaycard, said: "It is fascinating to see how live entertainment events have evolved over the past few years.

"Festivals are no longer just about the music, but about finding opportunities to discover new ways to have fun and make memories, whether that's taking a yoga class, trying out a new cuisine or seeing a comedian."





# The hidden cost of cash

Recent research has revealed the hidden cost of doing business in cash for the UK's small businesses.

Carried out by Square, the survey showed that nationally small business owners dedicate a collective seven million business hours a week at the bank dealing with cash – 81 minutes a week per business – and with 3,300 bank branches having shut since 2015 it is harder than ever for them to carry out basic banking services in their local area.

The research comes on the back of the changing nature of the UK high street - one in 10 shops are lying empty on the high street - the highest rate in four years and the economic uncertainty of Brexit.

Despite these shifts and the costs of cash handling, over half of the businesses (54%) surveyed still don't accept cards, putting themselves at risk of missing sales.

- In Nottingham the research showed that:
- 52% of people prefer to pay by card
  32% of people have been late with a payment

- 51% of people have been given the wrong change and said nothing
- 32% would never own up to being given too much change
- 22% of people think it is different for small vs large business
- 41% of businesses do not accept cash
- 50% of businesses have seen their taking go up since accepting card payments
- payments38% had poor or no digital skills when they started their business

Whilst small businesses spend time cashing up and traveling to and from the bank, consumer habits are changing fast. With 488 ATMs closing per month on the UK's high streets, cash can be hard for shoppers to access and spend.

Nearly half of Brits prefer to use their cards (47%) over any other form of payment, compared to only 30% who prefer to pay by cash. In fact, that preference for paying by card rises as high as 56% among the next generation of shoppers aged 25-34.





# Newark and Sherwood is joint safest district

Newark and Sherwood is the joint safest district in Nottinghamshire, according to new crime statistics. New indicative figures, released by Nottinghamshire Police and Crime Commissioner, report that the rate of crime in the district between April 2018 and March this year, was the lowest in the county. The survey concluded that within the

mix of independent businesses.

12-month period, the percentage of respondents having been a victim of crime in Newark and Sherwood was just 14 per cent, compared with Nottingham and Broxtowe, where the figure was 24 per cent of respondents.

In the past year, since Newark and Sherwood District Council launched its Cleaner. Safer and Greener initiative, the council, its partners and the police have taken a tougher stance on offenders who compromise the safety and welfare of residents.

As well as the partnership approach with police to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour, the council has also extended its frontline ability to deal with groups and individuals who break the law and make life a misery for residents. In January, two

community protection officers were recruited, with an additional two officers due to start shortly, with the power to issue fixed penalty notices (FPNs), ensure effective enforcement and increase public awareness of crime issues. The officers spend a vast majority of their time in the community, working directly with the public, the police, residents, businesses, key partners and parish and town councils to

create safer communities

Council leader David Lloyd said: "We have invested and will continue to invest in measures to improve safety and help minimise crime in the district.'

The council has also helped set up

a number of neighbourhood watch groups involving police, retailers, county and parish councils, to provide a forum for residents to raise concerns over crime in communities including Balderton and Hawtonville in Newark.

# COCKPIT-I

at Newark Air Museum

Preparations for the 2019 Cockpit-Fest are well underway at Newark Air Museum.

The museum is a registered charity located on part of the former site of RAF Winthorpe; its two day Cockpit-Fest event attracts exhibitors from across the UK and Europe to sample what one former-aviation magazine editor calls "grass roots aircraft preservation"

This will be the twentieth time likeminded enthusiasts have displayed their aircraft cockpit sections at the museum.

At this year's event a diverse range of aviation will be represented; this includes a range of military jet cockpits including amongst others: Lightning, Harrier, Hunter, Buccaneer and Jet Provost.

This year the museum's volunteers are also gearing up to provide visitors with an opportunity to look inside some of its

aircraft. This includes a rare opportunity to view normally inaccessible aircraft like the ex-Russian MiG fighters and the American T-33 trainer.

Cockpit-Fest takes place on Saturday 22 and Sunday 23 June and the event is being staged on the museum's Southfield Site, alongside an Aeroboot/Aerojumble aviation and avionics sale. Here enthusiasts can search out aviation artefacts, books and models.

There will also be visiting displays of local history/military vehicle groups; re-enactors, clothing and historical artefacts.

As an added bonus this year's event has a flypast on both days by aircraft from the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight.





# Partner support can help pregnant women quit smoking

Having a supportive partner can be the difference in helping pregnant women to quit smoking, new research by a team of researchers from the East Midlands has found.

According to the NHS 13 per cent of females in England smoke and around 10.5 per cent continue the habit when they become pregnant.

In response, the team – funded by National Institute of Health Research (NIHR) Collaboration for Leadership in Applied Health Research and Care (CLAHRC) East Midlands – explored the best ways of

how to support women and help them successfully give up smoking during their pregnancy.

Researcher Libby Fergie, from Division of Primary Care, School of Medicine, University of Nottingham, said: "Continued smoking during pregnancy poses substantial health risks to both the mother and baby. For example, the mothers' risks of having an ectopic pregnancy or a miscarriage are increased and the babies can become more prone to having growth problems, developing asthma or becoming a smoker later in life.

"We found that good support given by a partner in a quit attempt can be particularly useful, especially if the partner is trying to stop smoking too. For women who do not have a partner, or whose partner may be less willing to offer support, having a close friend, relative or nonsmoking 'buddy' to offer encouragement and assistance can also be helpful. Overall, although pregnant women can sometimes be reluctant to receive stop smoking support from a healthcare professional, those who do receive this type of support tend to find it really useful and are more likely to successfully stop smoking."
All the findings from

the study are being collected and will be used to form the basis of antismoking programmes to be integrated into standard NHS training initiatives.

A Nottingham dad is taking on a 50-mile cycle challenge to raise money for the Neonatal Unit where his son was treated as a baby.

Ben Cameron, from Bilborough, is taking part in Cycle Live in aid of the Big Neonatal Appeal, run by Nottingham Hospitals Charity. He is supporting the appeal to say thank you for the care his son Ollie received when he was born ten weeks early in July 2014.

Ben explained: "Ollie was born at 29 weeks gestation, weighing just 3lb 8oz. The neonatal doctor visited to warn us of the risks of premature birth and gave us a 60/40 chance of Ollie's survival.

"After a very scary few hours Ollie arrived in a breach position by natural labour. He was taken to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit immediately. We were physically and emotionally exhausted, just existing with tears of joy but completely overwhelming anxiety.

"It was a rollercoaster of taking hour by hour or day by day, watching and wishing Ollie to grow and develop, and seeing our family come into our bubble for a short time to see our beautiful boy, but then watching them leave back into the world that was still going on outside."

After several weeks of progress mixed with setbacks, which Ben de-

scribed as "an emotional rollercoaster", Ollie was finally discharged and allowed home at seven weeks old.

Ben said: "Ollie is now a happy and very healthy four-year-old and a fantastic big brother to his sister Sophie."

Ben took part in the 25-mile route at last year's Cycle Live, and has this year challenged himself to complete the 50-mile route in aid of the Big Neonatal Appeal.



A four-year-old hero from Nottingham will receive a bravery award from EMAS for coming to his dad's rescue when he collapsed and fell down the stairs.

Little Sebastian Cottam discovered his dad, Robert, unconscious at the bottom of the stairs in their family home in Langley Mill at 1.23pm on 10 April. The impact of the fall caused Robert to dislocate his right shoulder and left knee.

Despite being faced with a distressing situation, Sebastian remained calm, tried to wake his dad up, and retrieved the phone so Robert could call for help when he regained consciousness.

Robert, who had been making lunch at the time of the accident, said: "The next thing I remember is coming round when Sebastian tried to wake me up. I couldn't move and then I remembered I had left my phone upstairs.

"Sebastian remained calm and went to fetch me my phone, so I could call for help."

Sebastian understood his dad was unable to move until medical help arrived and so did everything he

could to make his dad comfortable.

Robert added: "Sebastian fetched me some medicine and a glass of water. He also gave me a bowl from his play kitchen in case I was sick.

"He was so brave and stayed by my side the whole time until the paramedics and his partner Gemma arrived."

Robert spoke to 999 call handler Sarah Ruckledge who arranged help for him.

When the ambulance arrived, Sebastian opened the front door to Graeme Tedds and Anthony Hancock, who treated his dad and took him to Royal Derby Hospital.

Sarah, Graeme and Anthony presented the young hero with a Laverick award at a ceremony at Sebastian's nursery last week.

The Laverick Award, which recognises children and young adults who have gone above and beyond to help another, is in memory of Nick Laverick – a paramedic team leader who died of cancer on his birthday in September 2013.
