

Sutton school signs Armed Forces Covenant

Paddy Tipping Welcomes Police

Confirmation that police officers will benefit from a salary boost this year has been welcomed by Nottinghamshire's Police and Crime Commissioner Paddy Tip-

Earlier today (12 Sept 2017) the government announced that it plans to lift the long-running 1% cap on public sector pay increases from next year and revealed that police officers will receive a 1% pay increase plus a one-off 1% bonus for 2017-18.

Commenting wards, the Commissioner said: "This is good news but I know that officers want to see increases in their base pay, not a one-off bonus. 'However, any increase costs money and with the rise coming from the police budget this is yet another call on In Nottinghamshire, we have worked incredibly hard to find the means to recruit 200 additional officers in 2017/18 and I don't want to see that put at risk.

Nationally, the 1% bonus will cost £50m between September 2017 and September 2018. In Nottinghamshire alone, the 1% bonus will cost £0.6m this year (from 1 September 2017 - 31 March 2018). Next year, the extra 1% will cost a further £1.1m. At this are not in the confirmed budget.



New sculpture launche

memorate Newark and Sherwood hosting the Ovo Energy Tour of Britain has been formally launched.

The piece of art, constructed from recycled bicycle parts donated by the general public and designed by sculptor Phil Neal, has taken pride of place in Newark's Sconce and Devon Park – close to the stage four finish of the Tour which took recently.

The chairman of Newark and Sherwood District Council, Councillor Linda Tift, performed the honours shortly before the day's race came to a conclusion.

The sculpture, which is five metres high and is positioned close to the play park, was commissioned by the district council and sponsored by Urban&Civic – the developers of Newark's urban extension Middlebeck . It is set against a backdrop of trees and shrubs in the corner of the existing children's

playground. Painted in saffron yellow, the adopted colour for the Nottinghamshire Stage Race, it stands above the ground on a green powderpression of a 'floating' yellow bike during the summer period while remaining easily distinguishable during the dark winter months. A dedication plaque on the playground fence explains its significance.

Councillor Tift said: "It was wonderful to host the Tour of Britain in our own district and this excellent sculpture is a fitting way to remember what a fabulous day our residents and many communities enjoyed. We can take pride in the way we welcomed this exciting sporting spectacle."

Matt Croft, project manager for Urban&Civic said: "We were very keen to support the town's hosting

new homes, cycling and dedicated cycleways, parks and outdoor living all play a key role in the community we are creating at Middlebeck.

"This sculpture demonstrates our commitment to Newark, providing a permanent link to our focus, and familiarising local people with the name of its newest neighbourhood, Middlebeck."

Large parts of the district featured in the 165km route, with the start in neighbouring Mansfield, before 120 or so of some of the world's top cyclists raced through the west of the district of Newark and Sherwood, Edwinstowe, Southwell and Sherwood Forest, looping north into Bassetlaw.

The competitors later pedalled

past the Trent villages dotted along the A1133 before moving eastwards into Lincolnshire and then back into Nottinghamshire via Coddington. They arrived in New-ark on Beacon Hill Road before venturing via Sleaford Road, Castle Gate, Lombard Street and then on to Farndon Road for the grandstand finish outside Sconce and Devon



Rescued pony helps lifelong rider fulfil dream of competing in top show A legal eagle is hoping to impress Year Show after beating 20 other on land at Shardlow.

A legal eagle is hoping to impress the judges when she swaps her office chair for the saddle and competes in the world's most famous horse show next month.

Emma Mrvik, who is head of residential conveyancing at the Beeston office of legal firm Ellis-Fermor & Negus, will leave paperwork behind to fulfil her dream of taking part in the Horse of the Year Show.

Her story is more remarkable considering that the pony she will perform on was rescued by the RSPCA.

Thirty-one-yearold Emma, who lives in Shardlow, Derbyshire, with partner Howard, was originally from Breaston and went to Ockbrook School. After leaving there she joined Ellis-Fermor & Negus at its Long Eaton office and studied part-time for a law degree at Nottingham University, which she gained in 2009.

"My mum and aunt both rode horses and having first had a rocking horse my parents bought me a Shetland pony for my second birthday, and I have been riding ever since," she said. Emma won her first trophy at the age of three and has continued successfully ever since, winning more than 80 trophies. She had one horse, Shamrock, for 19 years, until it died last year.

She qualified for the Horse of the

Year Show after beating 20 other riders, some of them professional, to win a class at the National Pony Society Championships in Malvern recently.





Unemployment in the East Midlands is better than the national average

Unemployment in the East Midlands continues to be better than the national average, latest figures show.

Quarterly data released this morning by the Office for National Statistics revealed unemployment at 4.3% across the country for the three months to the end of July, the best since 1975.

In the East Midlands, unemploy-

In the East Midlands, unemployment for the three months to the end of July was 3.91%, better than the previous quarter, a year and two years earlier.

Employment rates nationally, at 75.3% for the three months, were the highest since records began in 1971

In the East Midlands, the employment rate for the period for people aged 16+ was 59.01%, slightly down on the previous quarter, year and two years' figures.

and two years' figures.

The increase in the national figure, according to Government, is due to people of all ages finding work, with employment levels of those over 50 reaching a record high, youth unemployment falling by over 40% since 2010 and the proportion of young people who are unemployed and not in full time education dropping below five per cent for the first time.

cent for the first time.

The record figures were driven by increases in full-time and permanent work. In the past year, Government said, there was a shift from part-time to full-time employment and 20,000 fewer people on zero hour contracts.

zero hour contracts.

"Today's figures support the very latest data from our own Quarterly Economic Surveys which show that in the past three months 35% of firms increased their workforce and only 12% of firms reduced theirs," said Chris Hobson, Director of Policy at East Midlands Chamber*.

He added: "Of those that recruited, 64% said it was to cope with business growth but, worryingly, 59% said they had difficulty finding people to fill skilled manual, professional, managerial, clerical, unskilled and semi-skilled positions.

"And that's a problem that will only worsen as, despite the uncertainty of Brexit and having a Government without an overall majority, firms continue to grow and the available pool of potential workers keeps getting smaller. "It's imperative now that every ef-

for tis made to ensure the available workforce has the skills employers need and that those leaving academia have at least the basic maths, English and problem-solving skills that will make them employable.

"What today's figures really do is confirm the need for a sensible, long-term strategy for linking education policy to the needs of business and, more immediately, ensuring we don't hamstring ourselves with an overly restrictive immigration policy as we come out of the EU."

The figures released this morning showed the number of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance in August increased across Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire and Leicestershire when compared with July, with only Leicester city showing no monthly change.





Go-ahead for chapel transformation into graduation venue



Permission has been granted for Nottingham Trent University to convert a former chapel into a university hall for graduation ceremonies and performances. The former Wesleyan Chapel in Shakespeare Street was bought by the University earlier this year with the view to converting it into use as University Hall, preserving the listed building and securing its future. The original building, most recently used as a synagogue, was constructed in 1854 to designs by Thomas Stimpson but a large rear extension was added in 1976

Local architecture and construction consultancy YMD Boon has worked on the plans to replace this modern extension with a striking new space to be used as a music centre and dining area. The plans also include the renovation of the original chapel as a venue for graduations and other ceremonies or performances. The plans recently received approval from Nottingham City Council.

Matthew Hills, senior architect and heritage expert at YMD Boon, said: "We are proud to be working on this scheme which will restore this important building and transform it into a high-end facility that students and staff at Nottingham Trent University can be proud of, merging both old and new elements of the building together.

At the front of the chapel, facing Shakespeare Street, an enlarged foyer will be provided for the listed building facing Shakespeare Street, using solid glass

A new stained glass window is planned for the front of the building, depicting the University's crest.



Why Should You 6 Make a Will?

If you die without a will, there are certain rules which dictate how the money, property or possessions should be allocated. This may not be the way that you would have wished your money and possessions to be distributed.

Unmarried partners and partners who have not registered a civil partnership cannot inherit from each other unless there is a will, so the death of one partner may create serious financial problems for the remaining partner. If you have children, you will need to

the children can be made if either one or both parents die.

If your circumstances have changed, it is important that you make a will to ensure that your money and pos-

Who are executors?

Executors are the people who will be responsible for carrying out your wishes and for sorting out the estate. They will have to collect together all the assets of the estate, deal with all the paperwork and pay all the debts, taxes, funeral and administration costs out of money in the estate. They will need to pay out the gifts and transfer any property to beneficiaries.

Who to choose as executors...

It is not necessary to appoint more than one executor although it is advisable to do so, for example, in case one of them dies. It is common to appoint two, but up to four executors can take on responsibility for administering the will after a death.

Getting a copy of the will when probate has been granted

When someone dies, the person who is dealing with their estate (for example, money and property) must usually get authorisation to do so from the Probate Service. If there is a will, this authorisation is called a grant of probate. When probate is granted, the will is kept by the Probate Service and any member of the public can get a copy.





Patients have given care at Woodthorpe Hospital the thumbs up during an assessment carried out earlier this year.

A team of patient assessors gave excellent ratings to different aspects of the care setting at the Nottingham private hospital during the PLACE (Patient Led of the Care Environment) assessment which took place in May.
PLACE is a system for assessing the

quality of the patient environment and sees local people go into hospitals to assess how the hospital environment supports a patient's privacy and dignity, food, cleanliness and general building maintenance.

The annual assessment focuses entirely on the care environment, does not cover clinical care provision and it shows how hospitals are performing locally and nationally.

The findings from the assessment

have now been revealed and patients gave cleanliness a 99.3% rating and were very complementary about how clean the hospital was and how well it was maintained.

Food was also highly rated with patients with hospital food gaining a score of 95.73% score compared to 87.3% in 2016 while food on the hospital ward achieved a fantastic 98.89% rating compared to 88.65% in 2016.

Privacy, dignity and well-being achieved a 95.12% score compared to 84.78% in 2016 and 97.83%was the rating given to the condition, appearance and maintenance of the hospital.

The assessment also focused on how the hospital caters for patients with dementia and disabilities.

Dementia scored 98.42% compared with 85.457% in 2016 while Disability was given a 98.02% rating compared with 91.30% the previous year. Mark Lacey, General Manager at Woodthorpe Hospital was delighted with the results which continue to improve each year. Mark said: "These results give an

excellent indication of how patients rate our care environment at Woodthorpe and how these elements of care have improved significantly during the past year.

"The care setting for our patients is extremely important to us at Woodthorpe and we want to ensure that patients attending for surgeries and treatments are clean, comfortable and safe.

"These results reflect the excellent

environment we provide at Woodthorpe based on what patients have seen for themselves.3

Patient assessors also made a series of positive comments throughout the







"It has not been easy and we've worked hard to survive. However, I am delighted to say we are here to stay, that's official, and not only that but we are investing and will continue to do so to ensure our guests have the most wonderful experience possible."

The family is forging ahead with plans to invest in the property, a former 18th century coaching inn. Phase one is the refurbishment of the restaurant and cocktail bar, to the tune of £25,000. Phase two will involve an upgrade to the accommodation, in early 2018.



comfortable and orderly, although if something disturbs that order it can create anxiety, which we then need to put right. Generally speaking, we can live with these idiosyncrasies and incorporate them seamlessly into our everyday activities.

However, sometimes the need for order is so strong that we engage in repetitive behaviour that influences our routine and can even interfere with our men-tal and emotional well-being. In some instances this form of extreme anxiety requires medical intervention and support.

The dictionary definition of a phobia describes a persistent. irrational, abnormal or intense fear. Phobias can be triggered by traumatic experiences or learned behaviours and can usually be treated by therapies such as Cognitive Behaviour Therapy



(CBT) or gradual exposure to the trigger; sometimes in conjunction with medication.

Phobias are real and should be taken seriously. Many people experience one or more during their lifetime and some learn how to manage or overcome them so that the effect upon daily life is minimised. Indeed I am one of

those people, having successfully overcome my own fears of water and of caterpillars.

There are more than 100 common phobias, including fear of heights, going outside, spiders, snakes, darkness, social situations, flying and many more. Living with phobias can cause depression, panic attacks and


