Mowgli Street Food, the newest addition to the foodie scene in Hockley, this week launched their partnership with Nottingham Hospitals Charity to raise funds for Nottingham Children's Hospital.

The restaurant, which opened its doors yesterday, will be fundraising for the Big Appeal, Nottingham Hospitals Charity's fouryear campaign to raise £4million to enhance treatment, facilities and research at Nottingham Children's Hospital. The money raised by Mowgli will go towards a new intra-operative MRI machine – also known as an iMRI – for the Children's Hospital, which will help paediatric neurosurgeons treat children with brain tumours.

To celebrate the launch of the partnership, Mowgli hosted an event at its new premises, inviting clinical staff from the Children's Hospital. Mowgli's founder and owner, Nisha Katona, said: "My team in Nottingham are delighted to be working alongside Nottingham Hospital's Charity and supporting the fantastic work they do.'

Price 20p IZZN 5025-5P0P Charitable giving is central to Mowgli's business model. Each eatery, in Liverpool, Manchester, Oxford Birmingham, and now Not-

tingham, has its own house charity. Katona explains: "It's great for the staff to know that they are contributing through their work. I want them to develop their own careers understanding that charitable giving needs to be one of the central pillars of business.

"There is no doubt in our minds that the QMC and the Children's Hospital hold a special place in the hearts of people here they're totally iconic."

Stephanie Smith, Clinical Director of the Children's Hospital, said: "At the Children's Hospital, we perform over 1,000 MRI scans each year on young patients, including those with life-threatening brain cancer. The new iMRI machine for which the Mowgli team is fundraising will allow our neurosurgeons to administer the best possible treatment for these children and reduce the likelihood that they will need to undergo further surgery." Mowgli will be supporting the Big Appeal by adding a discretionary £1 donation to every bill. At the Liverpool branch, diners raised nearly £80,000 via this method.



Morley and Haywood Courts will be receiving energy efficiency measures, including a connection to the city's energy-from-waste, low carbon, heat network. Other measures include external wall insulation, new roof with solar system, battery storage, new A-rated windows and doors plus internal improvements to make living spaces larger and turning bedsits into one bedroomed flats. The apartments will be warmer than before but have lower bills and all their energy needs will be fully met from low carbon sources.

In a bid to future proof the network, part of the works will be to pilot the concept of low temperature district heating which could enable Nottingham to roll out this low carbon energy source to many more domestic properties in the future, at a much lower cost.

The network operates by distributing hot water over an extensive pipe network; this pilot will enable the network for The Courts to operate with a much lower temperature without any drop in heating and hot water performance for the households.

Resident John Hiley, who lives in Bryon Court which is the first of the four blocks to be regenerated said "I'm really pleased that my home is receiving these works to not only improve how it looks but to make it much cheaper to heat. Part of my flat will also be made bigger which is really welcomed. So far the works have been managed really well there is noise in the day but it is too be expected, from looking at the final designs and it will all be worthwhile."

# REDUCING UNEMPLOYMENT IN NOTTINGHAM

Nottingham City Council's unique employment and skills service Nottingham Jobs has been awarded over £4 million to support unemployed people of all ages and to help local businesses increase the skills of their employees with in-work training.

The funding which comes from the European Social Fund will enable the council to sustain its community-focussed activity across Nottingham and will be used to deliver three targeted employment projects in the city.

The three projects; GetAhead, MoveAhead and StayAhead are designed to support individuals whether they are unemployed or in work and in need of additional training to achieve their full potential.

The funding will be used to support unemployed residents from disadvantaged communities to access adviser-led training and pre-employment activities at centres which are local to them. GetAhead will help unemployed and inactive people aged over 16 who come from deprived backgrounds to overcome barriers which prevent them from finding sustainable employment.

MoveAhead will support unemployed and disadvantaged residents in Nottingham and across the region to boost skills and employment in five key sectors; construction, creative & digital, health & social care, transport equipment manufacturing and low carbon industry which are currently seeing skills shortages.

StayAhead allows SMEs in these five key

sectors to access high quality innovative in work training solutions to support internal training of employees, increasing their skills and helping them contribute more and sustain employment.





## PLANS SCRAPPED FOR NOTTINGHAM'S **CLEAN AIR** ZONE

Nottingham City Council have announced that citywide measures already under way to improve air quality mean a Clean Air Zone is no longer being considered. Councillor Sally Longford, Portfolio Holder for Energy and Environment, told full council that existing measures would reduce air pollution to below the legal limit, without the need for a Clean Air

Projects include retrofitting 180 NCT buses with clean exhaust technology, requiring every taxi and private hire vehicle in the city to low emission, and the council replacing its own heavy vehicles - such as bin lorries - with electric or other low

Longford said: "Results of air quality modelling showed these measures will have a significant effect in reducing emissions, bringing Nottingham into compliance by 2020. Although we considered a Class B Clean Air Zone - which would have affected HGVs, buses and taxis - the actions we're taking will have a positive impact across the whole city, rather than just in

The City Council has been directed by the government to take action to meet legal air quality limits as soon as possible, and is required to submit a local plan to DEFRA

NARC will also provide a clear means of communication with equivalent organisations in other countries and multinational initiatives. "Nottingham strongly supports NARC," said Professor Chris Gerada, Royal

Academy of Engineering Chair of Electrical Machines at the Faculty of Engineering, University of Nottingham. "NARC will be able to capitalise on the complementary skills of each partner to deliver a coordinated approach to impactful research programmes, training and state of the art facilities."

# Saving Lives in the East Midlands

Blood in urine is a crucial symptom of bladder and kidney cancer, yet only 14% of those most at risk in East Midlands – aged 50 or over – check the colour of their pee every time they go to the toilet.

Public Health England (PHE) launches new 'Be Clear on Cancer' campaign, running until 23rd September, in the East Midlands to highlight blood in pee as a key symptom of bladder and kidney cancers. The campaign will encourage everyone to 'look before they flush' and visit their GP without delay if they notice blood in their pee, even if it's just once.

A new short film is featuring the TV doctor, Dr Dawn Harper, is being released as part of the campaign. The film shows what to look out for as the colour of blood in your pee can vary.

Worryingly, around 50% of those surveyed in East Midlands said they would not seek medical advice if they saw blood in their pee only once. However, 45% of those surveyed said they would wait and see if it happened again, potentially putting off a vital diagnosis. BE Ben Anderson, Deputy Director for Healthcare Public Health at PHE East Midlands, said: "Cancer **CLEAR ON** survival rates are improving and we know finding cancer early saves lives, but there is still more to do to **CANCER** make people aware of the warning signs and to act on them.

"Our message is simple - please don't hesitate. If you have blood in your pee your doctor will want to see you."





Gedling Borough Council has completed the acquisition of Arnold Market and is now managing the market with immediate effect. In October 2017 the council announced plans to buy the market on Front Street, Arnold and have met with representatives of Thurland Estates Ltd, who previously owned the market, to be presented with the keys and take possession of the site.

The market will continue to operate as normal whilst work begins to improve the site and regular traders have been notified of the new arrangement

The council's future plans for the

its appearance and increasing the use for community events and activities. The council will also be looking at options for specialist markets, including evening and weekend markets.

The work to improve the market, which originally opened 50 years ago in 1968, will be phased. Some of the site will be closed immediately and hoardings put in place to allow new modern stall structures to be installed. Whilst these works take place the stall holders will continue to use the site.

The market improvement will be boosted by a bid for £1.25 million of funding from the N2 Town Centre Fund - part of the Local Growth Fund from the D2N2 Local Enterprise Partnership that supports town centre improvements

# Foster carer shares holidayingti

holiday is an exciting time. For foster carers it can feel like a military operation!

Most of us invest a lot of time, energy and dreams into our well-earned breaks, but for some foster children it can bring anxieties, which may be due to previous experiences, or worries over being somewhere unfamiliar. Holidays are opportunities to provide children with positive new experiences. Lin, a dedicated foster carer from Nottinghamshire, shares her experience of booking holidays for the whole family:

"I would say forward planning is key for successful travelling with children. I made play packs for the journey, including some currency, familiar



games and a 'can you see' list, which the children could check off things as they saw them on the journey and at the airport.

"We put up photos of the accommodation and destination round the house weeks before we went, so they were familiar images. We watched TV programs showing airports and planes taking off and landmeasures. We looked at the currency of the country we were travelling to and talked about it at mealtimes, before we learnt a few foreign words such as hello and thank you.
"For children with disabilities

you can request special assistance at airports. This fast tracks you through security, so no stressing while queuing and children get a play pack to look through with a wristband to identify them to staff. This wasn't just for physically disabled children, it is also for autistic children.
"Don't panic if things go

wrong, there's not much that airport staff won't have seen or heard before and most of all -



"Glaucoma was once an irreversible cause of blindness but now, thanks to medical advances, the condition is easily treatable with eye drops if detected in its early stages."

It is a condition whereby the pressure inside the eye goes up and compresses the optic nerve at the back of the eye. Gradually the patient loses vision in the peripheries but the danger is that they do not know it's happening. It is just like your blind spot, there is no black hole there as the brain fills it. Also consider where your field of vision ends, where there is no black line, it simply fades out. When the pressure is high there are no symptoms, the reason why 30 years ago patients with Glaucoma would often go blind.

These days we are fortunate enough to have opticians that check their patient's eyes regularly for symptoms related to Glaucoma and  $\hat{I}$  would encourage everyone to visit their optician for an eye test every 2 years, particularly if you have a family history of Glaucoma, as this means you have a 1 in 5 chance of developing it.

The key thing is detection. If we pick it up early the prognosis is excellent. Visit me for an assessment to see if you have Glaucoma or alternatively, book an appointment with your optician, who will be able to check that your eyes are healthy."

In the Dig For Victory Garden near the Anderson Shelter the produce is being readied for harvest and may be used to feed the volunteers who will be looking after the new World War II ROC (Royal Observer Corps) that will be completed in time for the event

All around the museum's extensive site, which will be developing a distinctive 1940s feel, the final display positions for visiting displays / groups are being set out; both under cover and outside. These displays include: vintage vehicles (cars and military

vehicles; local history groups; variety of themed wartime trade stalls; and will feature regular performances during the weekend by Fiona Harrison, "A Voice in a Million".

The museum wants to encourage as many visitors as possible to enter into the '1940s spirit' and to attend in period costume. Such participants will be admitted for free if they register in advance and at a discounted admission rate if they just turn up on the day. On both event days the museum has been granted flypasts by aircraft from the Battle of Britain

Memorial Flight, which is based just over the county border at RAF Coningsby.



A total of 85 Nottingham city centre establishments have succeeded in gaining Best Bar None accreditation this year which is a record number, with 76 of these receiving the top gold award.

Best Bar None is a national initiative supported by the Home Office that is designed to promote the responsible and effective management and operation of licensed premises.

The assessment process for this year's scheme has now been completed, with 85 venues being awarded the accreditation - 16 more than last year. This includes 76 receiving the top ranked gold status - 22 more than last year.

In order to achieve Best Bar None status, venues have to demonstrate they have policies and procedures in place to prove that they are safe, responsible and well operated and also comply with relevant legislation.

They are then assessed on areas such as the prevention of crime and disorder and measures they take to promote responsible drinking.

The highest scoring premises will now go through to an independent judging round, which will be undertaken by industry

experts. Those with the highest scores will be announced as the top venue in seven different categories including Best Bar, Best Pub and Best Cocktail Bar.

From the category winners, the judges will also choose an overall Best Bar None winner. The winners will be announced at a spe-

cial event on Tuesday 11 September 2018.

Andrew Crawford, a director of the Nottingham BID, said: "We

really pleased that more venever in Nottingham city centre have been successful in gaining the Best Bar None accreditation. It's good for the city, showing that the licensed venues take safety seriously."




