cy, Adtrak, is championing local charity Framework with two fundraising challenges this month.

The events will see 13 employees participating, each sporting their own bespoke Adtrak kit. From running to cycling, the ambitious team will be entering the Wollaton Park 10k Run and the 'Little' John Bike Ride, both based in and around Nottinghamshire. One daring staff member, Alasdair Purkis, is taking on both events.

First up is the Wollaton Park 10k Run, taking place on 15 June. Runners will embark on a multi-terrain marathon that will take them all around the ground's lakes, woods and paths.

The team then take on the challenging 'Little' John Bike Ride on 23 June - an arduous 100 miles that will take riders to every corner of Nottinghamshire, from Ossington to Langar.

After nominating Framework as its first official charity of the year in December 2018, the team has already participated in local charity events. Most recently, team members slept on the streets to raise awareness for Nottingham's homeless, as part of the charity's annual, record-breaking event, the Big Sleep Out, contributing to the impressive £40,000 raised.

Managing Director Chris Robinson commented: "We're fully behind our team members taking part in the events and are impressed so many are willing to take on what will certainly be a formidable feat. We've already raised £1468.50 since we started working with the charity in October 2018. It really is a privilege for us to be involved with such an essential organisation, especially one so close to home as Framework. In our continued partnership with them, we look forward to supporting their invaluable work for homeless people in the city.'

The University of Nottingham is one of over 50 universities with a 'Marrow' society, the name given to blood cancer charity Anthony Nolan's network of student volunteer groups.

This academic year marks 20 years since Nottingham Marrow, the first ever Marrow society, was created with the aim of recruiting students to the Anthony Nolan stem cell register. Over a quarter of stem cell donations that occurred in the last two years have been from donors recruited by Marrow.

This year Nottingham Marrow has recruited three times the number they did last year, which makes this their most successful year to date. They were also commended at the Anthony Nolan Supporter Awards in the Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic Advocate of the Year category for their work recruiting potential lifesavers from black, Asian and minority ethnic back-

#### Avoiding food waste brings out people's generous side

People would rather give away unwanted food to strangers than waste it, according to research from experts at the University of Nottingham.

The consequences of a growing social awareness of food waste and the ethical consequences associated with it have led to a variety of alternative food provision schemes such as mobile apps.

OLIO is a mobile app for food sharing, which aims to reduce food waste. It does this by connecting people with surplus food to those who need or wish to eat it. The food must be edible, and it can be raw or cooked, sealed or open. It was established in 2015 and is the most successful food sharing app ever created in terms of downloads. According to OLIO's statistics over a million people have registered and over 1,630,460 portions of food have been shared across 49 countries.

In partnership with OLIO, Dr John Harvey from Nottingham University Business School, analyzed 54913 instances of food sharing on the app between 9504 people over 10 months.

The results challenge existing theories around food sharing, such as the common belief that it is predominantly done so as a reciprocal act, and instead found that people who donated food rarely claimed it themselves.

Dr Harvey said: "As more food surplus becomes managed through applications such as OLIO, there is a real opportunity for policymakers to work with organisations to improve the accounting of food waste and to help identify vulnerable people experiencing food hardship. If OLIO can calculate a dependency index (i.e what proportion of the network are dependent on other new members of the network), this could give a profound insight into how macroeconomic policy is affecting the food consumption habits of consumers. The statistics could then be used to help inform government policy at a local and national level."



### Give unwanted bras to help girls in poverty

A Nottinghamshire-based entrepreneur, with a mission to make underwear accessible for all, is urging women to donate their unwanted bras to transform the lives of females in third world countries.

Janice Holmes, founder of Janice Rose Lingerie, has partnered with Newark-based charity, New Life Gambia and lingerie manufacturer, Naturana, to launch a collection for unwanted bras to be donated to girls and women in a west-African community.

Women and girls without underwear are more

Women and girls without underwear are more likely to be a target for rape and sexual abuse as a lack of such items symbolises a lack of money, implying they live in poverty.

In November this year, Janice and a group of volunteers from the charity will be travelling The Gambia to distribute the underwear to females and see first-hand how such a simple item of clothing can make such a difference.

She explained: "We all have a few forgotten bras at the back of our drawers that haven't seen the light of day for months or even years. Something that is so simple could potentially save females from being sexually assaulted so I would like to encourage people to check their drawers and please donate if you can. It will make a real difference.

"A shipping container will be sent to The Gambia in August in time for when we arrive in November. To donate before Monday, July 29, or to find out where your nearest drop-off location is, please contact me on janiceroselingerie@mail.com."

Sylvia Morgan, Sponsorship Director at New Life Gambia, said: "The families of the children in our schools live in extreme poverty and decent underwear for the women and older girls would be beyond their means."

A range of discontinued bra lines are also being donated to the project by Naturana, a supplier of Janice Rose Lingerie and one of Europe's biggest manufacturers of underwear and swimwear.

#### **Nottingham student** creates biker jackets from shredded pineapple leaves



A fashion student from Nottingham Trent University has created a biker jacket using an unusual substitute for leather shredded pineapple leaves!

Anna Keomegi (25), from Latvia, who is studying Fashion Product Design, said she was inspired to create menswear which was sustainable and promoted good mental health after her friend developed depression.

She explained: "It's important for guys to talk about their feelings, but it's not accepted in our society yet. So I wanted to create a unique garment that's strong and sustainable.

"Biker jackets always make people feel confident. When you put a biker jacket on it makes you feel strong. So I started to research fruit-based agricultural waste as a substitute for leather and was amazed by what I discovered."

Anna contacted Ananas Anam, a company which produces Piñatex, its own textile which is made from pineapple

She has designed and made three leather jackets - in black, white and brown - all of which are aimed at promoting good mental health and self-confidence. The lining of the jackets are made from sustainably sourced wood.

Anna said: "It's amazing to see the reactions people give when I tell them what the jackets are made from. Everyone tries to smell them - it's their first reaction. They don't smell of anything but people are intrigued because it's something different.

"Lots of people are becoming vegan today and more are thinking about buying ethically-sourced products. So I think a material like this has real potential for the modern market.

"It's amazing to think you can make high-quality biker jackets from the discarded leaves of pineapples."

#### Dads are our heroes

A string of sporting heroes, Hollywood actors and highprofile figures have all taken a backseat in a study of male role models – which was topped by dear old dad.

A poll of 2,000 UK men found one in four named their father as their top role model, ahead of Barack Obama, Muhammad Ali and Bobby Moore.

Men also voted their granddad into third place, with Winston Churchill the only famous figure to rank higher.

Brothers and best friends didn't fare so well, with men more likely to idolise Tom Hanks, Prince William and Morgan Freeman than their sibling or closest mate.

Dads also beat Game of Thrones hero Jon Snow and even the Pope to claim top spot.

Ex-world heavyweight champ Muhammad Ali, tennis legend Roger Federer and entrepreneur Sir Richard Branson also appeared in the top 10.

Other popular male role models to feature in the list include the late, great David Bowie, Olympic champion Mo Farah, actor Denzel Washington and Barcelona footballing icon Lionel Messi.

The study was commissioned by Gillette to launch #MyRoleModel, a campaign which celebrates fathers and recognises other important role shape and make men be the best they can be.



#### £15million spent on flood risk schemes

Nottinghamshire County Council's elected members have been updated on the continued work to reduce the risk of flooding to properties in the county. There are currently 18 schemes in progress in Nottinghamshire at a cost of £15million.

The 18 schemes, run and funded in partnership with other agencies and communities, aim to help those at greatest risk and include engineered designs, natural flood management and measures to make homes more resilient to surface water flooding in the future. The schemes which are either in the stages of feasibility, development or delivery cover Southwell, Egmanton, Titchfield Park, Lowdham, Thurgarton, Gunthorpe, Calverton, Arnold, Cropwell, Newthorpe, Girton, Sutton on Trent, Daybrook, Normanton on Soar, Willoughby on the Wolds, Clarborough, Gotham,

Newark and Mansfield Currently 78,700 properties are estimated as being at risk of flooding from surface water, groundwater and smaller watercourses across the county and over 480 localised reports of flooding have been investigated in the last eighteen months.

Councillor Phil Rostance, Vice Chairman of Communities and Place Committee said: "I have seen first hand how flooding devastates communities and I am pleased that today's report demonstrates the continued position of the council in relation to its flood risk responsi-

"As a lead local flood authority, Nottinghamshire is committed to taking an active role and continues to work closely with partners, including local communities, to mitigate the local flood risks across the county.'



# Rainbows staff in training for dragon boat challenge

Staff at Rainbows Hospice for Children and Young People are training hard to take part in this year's Nottingham Riverside Festival Dragon Boat Challenge.

The team, called Rain Boat, will take part in the challenge on Sunday 4 August.

More than 30 crews from across the East Midlands are expected to join Rain Boat to battle it out over the 200m race course on the River Trent at Victoria Embankment.



Children from Chuter Ede Primary School in Newark have been given a glimpse into local history after archaeologists hosted an exclusive visit to a new Barratt Homes develop-

accessible to people in need of a home and better ways of resolving disputes between tenants and landlords.

The strategy, which runs until 2024, is based on evidence and analysis of the local situation, a survey of local providers and interviews, focus groups and surveys of local people who are classed as



#### **UK** is fourth happiest place

The UK is only the fourth happiest place in Europe - when it comes to satisfaction with our homes. Poor natural light, bad air quality and a lack of space were revealed as some of main reasons Brits aren't satisfied with their living situation.

The GoodHome Report, the largest study of its kind ever conducted, surveyed 13,489 people across Europe, asking them a series of questions about happiness and the home.

And of 10 European countries polled, Brits lagged behind the Netherlands, Germany and Denmark in terms of 'home happiness'.

Poor natural light, bad air quality and a lack of space were revealed as some of main reasons Brits aren't satisfied with their living situation.

The startling statistics revealed that despite the trope of location being everything, people viewed having access to green space as more important than where they live. The report was created with independent think tank The Happiness Research Institute, who stated that whether people lived in the city or countryside it 'made no significant difference to happiness.'

Scoring an average of 7.69 out of 10, the Dutch were top of the list when it came to rating how happy they were with their homes. They were also the most likely to describe their home as 'spacious', with the report stating: "A feeling of spaciousness is three times more important than actual size.



The invention of the World Wide Web by Sir Tim Berners-Lee in 1989 and the first commercial jet flight which took place in 1952, travelling between London and Johannesburg, also featured.

# TRADITIONAL SKILLS ARE BEING REVIVED

Millennials are reviving a string of traditional tasks once destined for the history books, according to research.

A study into the traditional skills across generations found young adults are adept at skills such as framing pictures, calligraphy and knitting.

Crafting handwritten letters to keep in touch with loved ones is also among the tasks making a comeback.

Thirteen per cent are even learning woodwork and carpentry – and handmaking items such as tables, chairs, and bookshelves. The study also found two thirds of men and women aged 22 to 38 who took part in the research said the positive influence behind them learning new skills is their dad.

Ella d'Amato, Chief Commercial and Marketing Officer for notonthehighstreet, which commissioned the study of 2,000 adults said: "This study is reassurance that practical artisan skills are very much alive – despite a common assumption that young adults don't have time to be very 'hands on'.

"And what's really nice is that a large percentage of men and women have learnt much of what they know from their dad, as this shows traditional pasttimes, crafts and activities are continuing to make their way through generations."

The study found more than a fifth of millennials have been taught by dad how to grow their own vegetables.

Embroidery, origami and hand-making sculptures or clothing, while not skills shared by the majority of younger generations, are still being enjoyed by one in 20 adults, thanks to dad.

And one in 10 like to write poems, while a further 16 per cent enjoying baking cakes inspired by dad's passion and skill.



# Football crazy

Almost one-fifth of British football fans admit they would pull a sickie to watch their favourite team, according to new research into European supporters' obsession with the beautiful game.

Mastercard surveyed more than 14,000 people across nine markets to see how fans in different nations react at football matches.

It revealed Germans are the biggest screamers when their team scores, while the French are most likely to go in for an emotional cuddle when their favourite footballers put the ball in the back of the net.

The survey revealed when it comes to British fans, 18 per cent admit they're so obsessed with their side they'll skive off work to watch them play. Incredibly, 10 per cent also said they have lied to their partner about going to attend a match while 16 per cent revealed they would cancel a date if it meant going to watch their team play for 90 minutes. A staggering 38 per cent of football fans in the UK believe watching the match in the ground uses up the same amount of energy the likes of N'golo

Kante and James Milner use while charging around the pitch for an hour-and-a-half.

However, this figure rises to 91 per cent in Turkey, where the supporters are notorious for creating a fierce atmosphere inside their stadiums.

Mastercard carried out the research into fans' passion after developing a new technology called Kit Beats, which allows one person to feel another's heartbeat in real time. It has been built into

It has been built into uniforms and could allow fans to feel the emotions and heartbeat of the players as they play.





#### - 'one of the most handsomest villages in the county'

The highly regarded village of Collingham is situated on the eastern edge of Nottinghamshire at the side of the Trent Valley seven miles from Newark-on-Trent. It benefits from a wide range of shops and services, including three churches, a variety of shops and services and a primary school.

Collingham has excellent road, rail and bus links to Nottingham, Lincoln and Newark and there is a substantial conservation area with a rich mix of domestic architecture dating from the 16th century to present day.

The village is centrally located close to the A1 which gives access to the national road network. The local train station connects with Lincoln,

Newark and Nottingham and the inter-city service from Newark Northgate station to London King's Cross station has a scheduled journey time of around 80 minutes, making it the ideal commuter village.

Residents are within easy reach of a variety of leisure activities, from the nearby sports centres and swimming pools to the many cinemas, theatres, bars and restaurants available in Newark, Nottingham and Lincoln.

#### What's in a name?

The name Collingham is derived from the combination of Saxon words 'inga' meaning

people, 'ham' meaning settlement and 'Colla', which was the name of the chief. Bronze age and Roman finds in Collingham would suggest that there has been a settlement on the same site long before Saxon times.

It is possible that 'Long Collingham' was split into two by early Danish settlers, who called one half 'Northbie' and 'Southbie'. Later in medieval times, North and South Collingham existed as two parishes. The "advowson" (rights) belonged to Peterborough Abbey. Today the village is one settlement and the two main streets, High Street and Low Street are connected several times by narrow lanes.



#### One of the handsomest villages in the county

With a wide variety of beautiful houses in the village there is little wonder that in 1832 White's directory of Nottingham called Collingham "one of the handsomest villages in the county".

Houses in the conservation area reflect the history of Collingham, with properties dating back to the 16th century.

#### John Blow Primary School

by the highly rated John Blow Primary School, which describes itself as a "busy but friendly school, with lots going on" on its


